Input:

Regarding the agenda items 23081 & 23082, I live in the neighborhood, walk along the riverwalk daily, and find this project to be extremely exciting! I am thrilled with the approach of this site. I Fully support this project & am excited to see how it transforms the neighborhood!

I do have 1 concern though that I want to bring up. I would strongly implore the planning commission to push for a better, more direct connection to the existing riverwalk.If I'm looking at the plans correctly, this extension requires pedestrians to walk all the way from the river to the existing crosswalk/traffic signal, then all the way back. While the added walk is super minor in the grand scheme of things, I feel this setup fundamentally detracts from the value created by the riverwalk system by creating unnecessary segmentation and incentivizes just walking on Plankinton instead of continuing down the riverwalk. I strongly feel that a grade separated connection should be required for this connection.

There is plenty of clearance under the bridge in the river & Clybourn is elevated high enough from the existing riverwalk that a land based solution such as a pedestrian tunnel could potentially also be feasible as well. It is frustrating that this design does not incorporate a low stress path that doesn't require negotiating with the terrible crosswalk that currently exists on Clybourn.

While I understand that there are design/cost/regulatory issues associated with touching the waterway/road, I feel that the current approach feels uninspired & doesn't mesh well with the existing riverwalk system. The approach this design takes makes the riverwalk feel segmented in a way that truly detracts from its utility.

Please provide a better connection to the riverwalk.
