Dear Council Members:

Dragana Jankovic alleges that on September 14, 2021 at approximately 6 a.m. her water pump was continuously going off at her property located at 4345 South 60<sup>th</sup> Street in Greenfield, Wisconsin. She went to her basement to find that the basement had flooded, and the water continued to rise. Ms. Jankovic submitted a damage claim for the amount of \$7,032.79 for personal property damage and repair expenses not covered by her homeowner's insurance.

Milwaukee Water Works records indicated that on September 14, 2021, the Milwaukee Police Department reported a leak in the street at 4345 South 60<sup>th</sup> Street. A water investigator was dispatched and confirmed a break on an 8" water main at that address and completed an emergency shutoff of the water main. Later that day, Digger's Hotline was contacted to locate and mark underground utilities. When Digger's Hotline provided clearance, water shutoff notices were served to local residents at 12:00 p.m. and the water main was placed out of service at 2:15 p.m. After the repairs were completed, the water main was placed back in service at 8:00 p.m.

On September 21, 2021, Ms. Jankovic contacted Milwaukee Water Works again to report further water back up in her basement. An investigator was dispatched and confirmed water was emerging from the floor drain. She was told to hire a private plumber to investigate further and determine whether the issue with the sewer was occurring before or after the curb line. The claimant hired Roto Rooter, and they could only clear up to 70' of the sewer lateral before encountering clay and rocks.

Ms. Jankovic reported the results to the City of Greenfield, who then notified Milwaukee Water Works of the findings. On September 24, 2021 Milwaukee Water Works contracted with Mid City Corporation to complete repairs and jet the sewer lateral. Final restoration of the repair site was completed on September 30, 2021.

It is our position that Milwaukee Water Works took action as soon as it was informed of the water main break, and performed repairs in a timely manner. The damage to the sewer lateral was the result of the water main break and not the report work performed by Milwaukee Water Works.

Milwaukee Water Works acknowledges that losses caused by the damaged sewer lateral may have been mitigated if the subsequent repair work had not been delayed for 10 days following the water main break. As such, we recommend the claim be approved for payment.
