The work was found to be consistent with preservation guidelines. The following conditions apply to this certificate of appropriateness:

Existing zinc and clear glass art windows will be restored replacing zinc came where necessary and cementing glass and zinc upon completion. Wood sash sills and jambs will be restored with wood epoxies and then sanded, primed and painted. Original materials will be restored wherever possible.

All work must be done in a craftsman-like manner, and must be completed within one year of the date this certificate was issued. Staff must approve any changes or additions to this certificate before work begins. Work that is not completed in accordance with this certificate may be subject to correction orders or citations.
