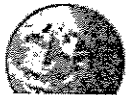

Replying on the revenue issues at this point.

The eight host communities agreed to the following division for the revenue side only: each of the current 3 newest units, 1 - Oak Creek, 1 - (2nd) North Shore, and 1 - (9th) of Milwaukee will get -- 2004-6.6% of revenue of 15 units

2005-6.2% of revenue of 16 units

2006-5.8% of revenue based on 17 units or all 17 units will get a full share of the revenue.

For the county funded side of \$3,000,000.00, this dollar figure should be divided by 17 units.

All eight host communities accepted this.

Addendum


Effective January 1, 2004 the City of Milwaukee entered into an agreement with the County of Milwaukee for the provision of Paramedic Services. It was agreed that the reimbursement structure for these services would be a combination of revenue and tax levy. The allocation of fund distribution was determined by the Intragovernmental Coordinating Council (ICC).

It is understood by both parties to the Agreement that effective January 1, 2005 in accordance with an ICC directive:

- The distribution of tax levy at one seventeenth of three million dollars remains the same.
- For 2005 dates of service, the share of revenue percentage changes to fifty-four and one sixth percent (54.1667%) of net collections minus any expenses as identified in 4.1.11 and subsequent subparagraphs of the 2004 – 2005 agreement.
- All other provisions of the agreement remain unchanged.

In witness whereof, the parties hereto, represented by officials authorized to bind them, have caused this addendum to the Agreement to be executed as of January 1, 2005.
