To Whom it may Concern:

I am writing to object to the recommendation of the report of the Licenses committee concerning my (Deeph In Brueggemann) bartender's application. In particular, I object to the Findings of Fact "conclusions of law statement" (#2) that was sent to me on December 10, 2009 and received by me on December 12, 2009.

In this particular paragraph it states, quote "Based on the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the lisenses, Joseph H. Brueggemann, has not met the criteria of Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes or Chapter of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances to allow renewal of the Class "D" Bartender license based upon nonappearance".

If I had known that appearing at the hearing would result in the potential of being awarded the license, I would most certainly have appeared. However, the notice I was sent on November 23rd, and received on November 25th stated clearly that "you will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial". In fact, I did not appear to the hearing on December 8th, because I didn't have a challenge for the charges/reasons given for denial. The information supplied in the reports was accurate and I didn't believe that I was to attend, unless I was challenging the accuracy of the convictions (OWI-1st 1992, OWI-1st 2005, OWI- 3rd 2007). I did not know or understand that even if I wasn't challenging the accuracy of the convictions, I should still appear.

In fact, I understand and accept these convictions as part of my past and have paid dearly for those mistakes including fines, jail time, high insurance, counseling costs, etc. Likewise, it was my belief that my application was being denied for those convictions, thus I had nothing to gain by attending the hearing on December 8th (I saw nothing to the contrary on my notice) and I believed that my license was going to be denied no matter if I attended or not. I now understand that is not the case.

After receiving the most recent letter from the Clerks office (dated 12-10-09), it appears that had I shown up for that meeting on the 8th, my license may have indeed been approved, regardless of those past convictions. If this is the case, I would welcome the opportunity of speaking with someone regarding this matter, and potentially meeting with the common council on 12-22-2009 with hopes of obtaining my license.

I'm certain these words are uttered far too often in cases such as these, but my past transgressions have allowed me to become a changed individual with regard to alcohol and responsible behaviors. I am just a person trying to make a living in the profession that I love. Since my last conviction in 2007, I have attended over a years worth of counseling sessions and have given up drinking completely and have been much better for it. From a professional standpoint, I have been an upper level manager with a respected Milwaukee company for over 22 years and part of my job involves serving alcohol. As such a bartending license is a tool needed to successfully extend my career. Thus, I am hoping that this letter doesn't come up short with regard to allowing me an opportunity to potentially keep my license.

Re: Report on the Renewal Application of the Class "D" Bartender License of Joseph H. Brueggemann

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Joseph H. Brueggemann (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Class "D" Bartender license in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Said license expires at midnight, December 31, 2009.

2. An application to renew said license was untimely filed with the Office of the City Clerk on October 12, 2009.

3. Pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. On October 13, 2009, the Milwaukee Police Department responded with a police report that could form a basis for non-renewal or suspension of said license.

4. On November 23, 2009, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the licensee pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes of the report of the Milwaukee Police Department and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the Police Department report on December 8, 2009, commencing at 1:30 p.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee did not appear and he was not represented by counsel.

5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:

A. A notice of the hearing as well as a copy of the police report was sent to Joseph H. Brueggemann at 1730 North 118th Street, Wauwatosa, Wisconsin 53226 on November 23, 2009 by U.S. prepaid first-class mail in an envelope bearing the return address of the License Division. The address of 1730 North 118th Street, Wauwatosa, Wisconsin 53226 is the address given by the Licensee on his application. The envelope was not returned to the License Division by the United States Postal Service. The licensee failed to appear at the hearing on December 8, 2009.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes and Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances.
- 2. Based on the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Joseph H. Brueggemann, has not met the criteria of Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes or Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances to allow renewal of the Class "D" Bartender license based upon nonappearance.
- 3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Licenses Committee that the full Common Council should exercise its discretion to not renew the Class "D" Bartender license held by Joseph H. Brueggemann based upon nonappearance.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of four (4) ayes, zero (0) noes and one (1) excused, recommends that the Class "D" Bartender license be denied based upon nonappearance.
