Re: Creation of Section 36-05-6-d-3 (Voluntary Separation)

Dear Ms. Bahr:

As requested, we have reviewed the proposed amendment to Chapter 36 – and accompanying Board Rule – that would authorize the Annuity and Pension Board to make an election of deferred retirement on behalf of a member who voluntarily separates from service should the member fail to elect between a refund and a deferred retirement within six months of notification from ERS.

Currently, s.36-05-6-d-2 requires the member to make an election between a refund and a deferred retirement within 30 days of voluntary separation from service. However, it is administratively impractical for ERS staff to require a member to make an election within this time frame. The proposed changes would give the voluntarily separated member the same period of time to make his election – six months from notification – as that currently given to a member who separates involuntarily.

In addition, the proposed Charter amendment and Board Rule would conform the Charter and Rules to the current practice of the ERS staff, which practice has been followed consistently since the late 1950s.

It is our opinion that this change will have no fiscal impact on the Employes' Retirement System.
