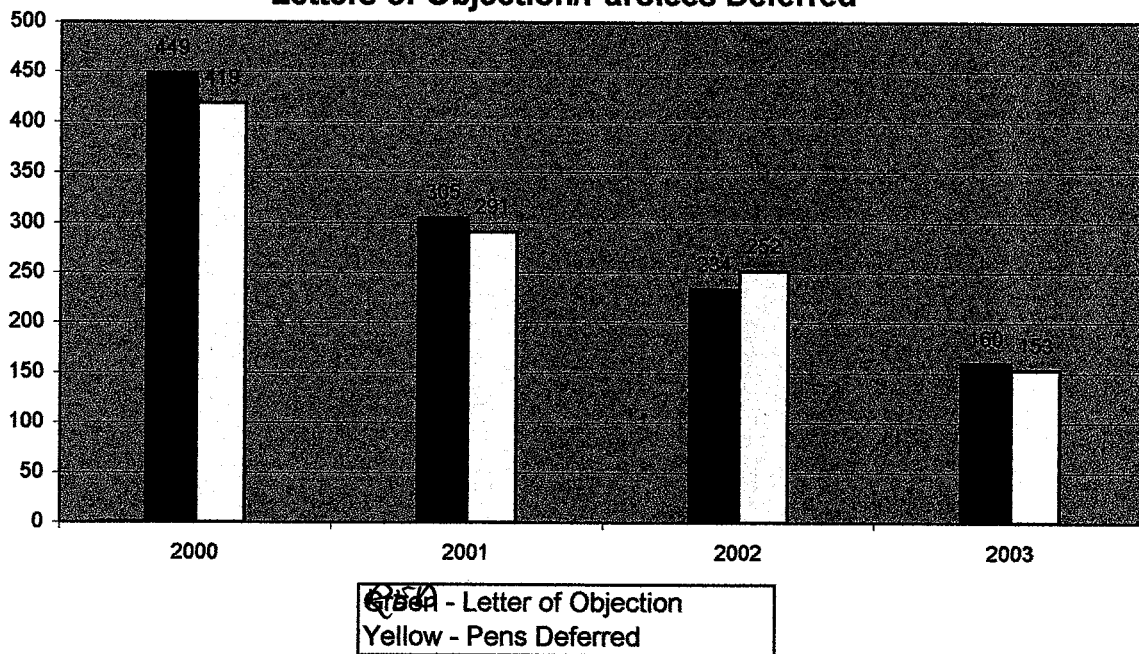

2 men charged in 2 sexual assaults

Victim's description led police to stepbrothers

Before two stepbrothers were arrested for raping a woman and savagely slashing her with a razor knife in a car, one of them tried in vain to scrub the woman's blood from the vehicle's upholstery, according to a criminal complaint filed Thursday.

So when the victim's description of her assailants and heads-up police work led officers to the home of the man who tried to wash the blood away, the bloodstained car was out front, court documents say. A subsequent search located the woman's clothing in the man's bedroom and her jacket in his car trunk, according to the complaint and other documents filed in circuit court.

After the stepbrothers were arrested in connection with that attack, the victim in an unsolved rape from November identified the two as her assailants, as well, the complaint says.

Daniel Darenzo King, 31, of the 1800 block of N. 39th St. and Joseph Robert King, 18, of the 4200 block of N. 19th Place each were charged in the complaint with robbery, first-degree sexual assault and substantial battery in the prior attack Nov. 29; and kidnapping, first-degree sexual assault and substantial battery in the rape and box cutter attack that started late Saturday and stretched into Sunday morning.

The complaint says:

The weekend's ordeal began when the victim was en route to her sister's home and a Lincoln Town Car stopped while she was walking along W. Center St. A man jumped out the passenger door and forced her into the back seat, where he joined her before the Lincoln took off.

zig-zagging through alleys before stopping behind homes in the 2600 block of N. 22nd St. There the men took turns sexually assaulting her.

The two eventually told the woman to get dressed, and one handed her some money.

"I didn't ask for anything," she said, prompting a man to punch her and demand his money back.

She was then ordered to remove her clothing, and, as she did so, she was slashed with the razor knife repeatedly before she eventually escaped and ran nearly naked down the alley.

She made her way to a home where the residents let her inside and summoned help. She was treated at Froedtert Memorial Lutheran Hospital for a broken eye socket and cuts to her chest, arms, right hand and left shin.

During a subsequent briefing, Officer Deborah Kranz realized the victim's description of one of the assailants matched the features of Daniel King, a paroled sex offender.

When police arrived at his home, he quickly ducked inside but later surrendered.

The Nov. 29 incident occurred when a car stopped suddenly beside a woman walking in the 2500 block of N. 7th St. A man jumped out and demanded money while holding a liquor bottle.

After the woman handed over \$65, she was ordered to remove her clothes and was sexually assaulted on a concrete slab.

The driver watched the rape and, after it, clubbed the woman twice in the head with the liquor bottle. She ran to a friend's home and was later treated at a hospital for wounds to her face and head.

Community Parole watch has researched felony cases F-913981 and F-920237 involving inmate #171947. The defendant, Daniel King, becomes eligible for parole on January 14, 1997 and has a parole hearing scheduled for November of 1996. We are taking action on the case because we are concerned about the apparent disregard for the laws that protect our community from crimes, such as the one committed by Mr. King.

Due to the severity of his crime, we feel that Mr. King needs more time to think about his transgressions and should be given more time to reflect upon his behavior and how it affects all members of society. Law abiding citizens should not have to fear the reentrance into the community of someone who shows no regard for others or for the laws, as does Mr. King.

Community Parole Watch recommends that Mr. King not be granted parole at this time.

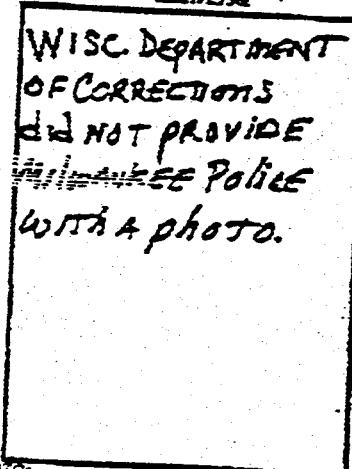

Wisconsin Sex Offender Registration and Community Notification law became effective June 1st, 1997, with the enactment of Wis. State Statute 301.45 and 301.46 (Act 440). (COPIES ATTACHED) In order to fully understand why a Sex Offender and Community Notification law was needed and how it was intended to be used, the following brief history of notification is offered.

Megan's Law was enacted in October of 1994 in New Jersey after 7-year old Megan Kanka was raped and murdered by a convicted sex offender. Megan's Law gave New Jersey the right to notify communities when a sex offender was being released into their neighborhoods.

President Clinton signed a federal version of Megan's Law in March of 1996. Several States, including Washington, Arizona, California, Kansas and Minnesota have adopted similar or even more drastic measures.

Wisconsin passed a sex offender registration and notification law, effective June 1, 1997.

Sex offenders pose a continuing risk of engaging in sex offenses even after being released from incarceration or commitment. Protection of the public from sex offenders is a paramount governmental interest.

Persons found to have committed a sexual assault have a reduced expectation of privacy because of the community's interest in public safety and in the effective operation of government. Registration, while on supervision and following expiration from sentence, serve as a means for monitoring and tracking the whereabouts of sex offenders in the community.

Community notification, or the release of relevant information about sex offenders to law enforcement, public/private entities and the general public will further the governmental interests of public safety and enhance strategies for crime detection and prevention. Notification will increase accountability through enhanced information sharing within, and between, the criminal justice system and the community.

The law attempts to provide flexibility to the agency of jurisdiction and law enforcement in order to expand or reduce community notification based on case-by-case factors - leaving discretion to individualized notification strategies.

The law also attempts to strike a responsible balance between community protection, the public's need to be informed, and the need to create an environment that enhances the offender's likelihood for successful reintegration within the community.

In addition, the law seeks to be sensitive to the potential impact on victims, containing safeguards to reduce the possibility of re-victimization and harassment.

We can see that the two basic intents of the law is to keep track of the sex offender through the registry and notify the community of the offenders whereabouts. The Department of Corrections maintains the registry, while the local Police Chief is responsible for notification process to be used in their community.

Guidelines for Wisconsin Law Enforcement (ATTACHED) were developed in a collaborated effort by the Wisconsin Chiefs of Police Association, Wisconsin Badger State Sheriffs Association, and the Department of Corrections. Although these guidelines are just guideline, and not laws, most law enforcement agencies, have used them to develop their own Policy and Procedures involving sex offender registry and notification.

Upon review of the guidelines and follow-up discussions with personnel from the following

Police Departments, Eau Claire, Appleton, Madison, and Seattle, Washington, one thing remained constant to having a good notification system in place. Each department, had a core group (fixed committee) in place, whose only purpose is to review each Special Bulletin Notification received from the Department of Corrections. The core group reviews all the relevant information available on the sex offender.

There is no standard makeup of a core group. Each Police Chief based on their community needs, decides who and at what level of involvement is required. Generally a core group includes representatives from Sensitive Crimes Units of the Police, Sheriff, District Attorney, and Department of Corrections. Based on the offenders actions, the core group can also include representatives of the School Districts, University Public Safety, and any adjoining Police Department.

Upon a thorough evaluation and discussion by the core group, a level of notification is recommended to the Police Chief. After receiving the final approval from the Chief the appropriate notifications system is put into place. Some departments handle their own notification (including door to door) others receive assistance from school districts, community watch programs, etc.

Community Parole Watch, a City-Wide funded program would gladly assist as needed in the notification process. After the core group recommendation, and Chiefs approval, Community Parole, with the aid of a census track where the offender will reside, would notify the Neighborhood Organization involved. CPW would assist the groups in determining the method of notification. Such as community meetings, flyer distribution, etc.

Attached you will find a copy of Madison Police Depts. latest SBN, and procedure used in the notification process. You can observe the SBN is user friendly, very informative, has a good description, and contains two clean photos of the offender.

There is no doubt that having a core group can be time consuming and additional burden on departments budgets. No money or time can erase the victimization of our children and loved ones.

It is a fact that the City of Milwaukee needs to improve its notification system. Using the guidelines and examples attached, specific Policy and Procedures can be developed and put into place without re-inventing the wheel.

Future consideration should be given to establishing a CPW web page within the City of Milwaukee internet system. This could be of special use to the MPS Stranger Danger Education program.
