### The Milwaukee and North Shore Speed Enforcement Task Force

**Grant Type:** New Grant

**Grantor:** State of Wisconsin, Department of Transportation (DOT), Bureau of Transportation Safety (BOTS)

**Grant Period:** June 1, 2017 - August 31, 2017

**Award Amount:** \$80,000 (MPD \$50,000; \$10,000 to each sub-awardee)

**Match Required:** \$20,000 (25% - Soft Match)

**Fiscal Agent:** City of Milwaukee Police Department

**MPD Sub-Awardee:** Village of Whitefish Bay Police Department; City of Glendale Police Department; Village of Shorewood Police Department.

**Allocation Purpose:** To decrease the incidence of targeted driving violations, related crashes and to increase voluntary compliance with traffic regulations; thereby decreasing fatalities and serious injury collisions by way of proactive and highly visible enforcement effort.

**Partners:** City of Milwaukee Police Department (MPD); Village of Whitefish Bay Police Department; City of Glendale Police Department; Village of Shorewood Police Department.

#### Program Goals

The objectives for this operational plan are to decrease the incidence of targeted driving violations, related crashes and to increase voluntary compliance with traffic regulations thereby decreasing fatalities and serious injury collisions by way of a proactive and highly visible enforcement effort. Officers involved in the campaign will take a zero-tolerance on the following violations: a) Primary— speed and aggressive driving violations, b) Secondary— operating while intoxicated/impaired, and c) additional— occupant restraint violations. The main objective is to gain and maintain voluntary and continued compliance with the targeted traffic laws thereby improving motor vehicle crash survivability rates and reduction of long-term disabilities.

#### Programmatic Summary

The Milwaukee and North Shore Speed Enforcement Task Force, which includes MPD, the Village of Whitefish Bay Police Department, the City of Glendale Police Department, and the Village of Shorewood Police Department, was created with the intent of bringing together a multi-jurisdictional Traffic Safety Task Force geared towards a High Visibility Enforcement (HVE) effort focused on decreasing traffic crashes and obtaining voluntary compliance with traffic regulations.
