Allocation Purpose: This grant allows for law enforcement serving the ten municipalities with the highest rates of violent crime in Wisconsin to reimburse overtime costs associated with beat patrols. Funds awarded by this grant are to be used for reimbursing overtime costs for uniformed law enforcement officers whose primary duty is beat patrol.

Research & Evaluation: Four progress and financial reports must be completed and submitted in the Egrants system throughout 2019 and early 2020. These reports should indicate active efforts to achieve and measure stated goals and objectives, appropriate documentation of task force activities and case outcomes, and adherence to any conditions included in the grant award.

Program Goals

Decreasing crime trends in specific high-crime neighborhoods are maintain through constant presence and engagement of officers who regularly police and serve the residents of those neighborhood. The overtime pay from the grant award will help to maintain an constant police presence to deter crime and improve community connections.

Programmatic Summary

The Beat Patrol - Overtime program provides additional overtime funds to support police personnel for community policing work, or beat patrols targeting specific local crime issues. Funds are available to the ten Wisconsin communities with the highest rates of violent crime index offenses in the most recent full calendar year for which data is available under the uniform crime reporting system of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
