Re: Report of the Renewal Application of Michael L. Hundley-Hodges for a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver License.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Michael L. Hundley-Hodges (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Said license expired at midnight, October 31, 2010.
- 2. An application to renew said license was filed with the Office of the City Clerk on March 1, 2011.
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Milwaukee Police Department filed a police report dated December 7, 2011. That report could form the basis of non-renewal or suspension of this license.
- 4. On December 20, 2011, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee, pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes of a police report that could form the basis for suspension or non-renewal of the license of the licensee and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report on January 11, 2012 at 9:00 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee did not appear and was not represented by counsel.
- 5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
 - A. Notice was sent to Michael L. Hundley-Hodges at 2537 North 34th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53210, along with a copy of the police report on

December 20, 2011 in an envelope which was sent by U.S. first-class prepaid mail in an envelope bearing the return address of the License Division, 200 East Wells Street, Room 105, Milwaukee, WI 53202. The address of 2537 North 34th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53210 was the address given by the applicant on his renewal application. The notice included a copy of the police report. The licensee failed to appear at the hearing and the envelope containing the notice and police report was not returned to the License Division by the U.S. Postal Service.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24, Wisconsin Statutes.
- 2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Michael L. Hundley-Hodges, has not met the criteria of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of his Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license based upon nonappearance.
- 3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Public Safety Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to not renew the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license held by Michael L. Hundley-Hodges based upon nonappearance.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee recommends that the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license of Michael L. Hundley-Hodges be denied based upon nonappearance.

Re: Report of the Renewal Application of Rajdeep S. Grewal for a Public Passenger

Vehicle Driver License.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Rajdeep S. Grewal (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Said license expires at midnight, October 31, 2012.

- 2. An application to renew said license was filed with the Office of the City Clerk on September 8, 2011.
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Milwaukee Police Department filed a police report dated September 9, 2011. That report could form the basis of non-renewal or suspension of this license.
- 4. On January 12, 2011 the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee, pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes of a police report that could form the basis for suspension or non-renewal of the license of the licensee and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report on January 26, 2012 at 9:00 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee did appear and was not represented by counsel.
- 5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
 - A. On May 22, 2008 the applicant was cited by Milwaukee County Sheriff for operating while intoxicated (1st offense) and refusal to

submit to chemical test. The applicant was found guilty of operating while intoxicated on August 22, 2008 and a 6-month revocation of his license was imposed. The applicant was found guilty of refusal to submit to chemical test on August 22, 2011 and a 12-month license revocation was imposed.

- B. On July 18, 2009 the applicant was charged in Fond du Lac County with disorderly conduct, operating after revocation and refusal to submit to chemical test. The disorderly conduct and operating after revocation citations were dismissed on August 19, 2009. The applicant was found guilty of refusal to submit to chemical test on August 19, 2009 and a 2-year license revocation was imposed.
- C. On January 27, 2010 the applicant was charged in Kenosha County with bail jumping and operating after revocation. The applicant was fond guilty of both of these charges on March 18, 2010 and a fine was imposed.
- D. The applicant's driver's record lists these addition revocation, suspension and conviction not part of the sentences for Items A-C.

During the periods of suspension and revocation the applicant failed to return his public passenger vehicle license to the City Clerk as required by City Ordinance § 100-59-1-b.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24, Wisconsin Statutes.
- 2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Rajdeep S. Grewal, has not met the criteria of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of his

Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license without undergoing a sixty (60) day suspension based upon the police report and driving record.

3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Public Safety Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to renew the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license held by Rajdeep S. Grewal with a sixty (60) day suspension based upon the police report and driving record.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee by vote of four (4) ayes and one (1) noe recommends that the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license of Rajdeep S. Grewal be renewed with a sixty (60) day suspension based upon the police report and driving record.

Said suspension is to be in effect from the date of Common Council action on February 7, 2012 through midnight, April 6, 2012
