WHEREAS,

Coggs and her office, Deshea Agee of Historic King Drive BID, business owners, community organizations and local artists; and*

WHEREAS, *Katrina Hunt, with love for the Bronzeville community, projects, and partners, is planning to move into the area and will attend the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee in the Community Engagement and Education (CEED) program to further her work in community development, and will stay connected with all of her peers and mentors that she has met this year through Public Allies and UEDA, and Katrina Hunt is clearly an exemplary student and young woman, who never fails to reach for and embrace the educational opportunities presented to her, like the Freedom Scholarship Essay Contest; now, therefore, be it*
