2 PRESIDENT HINES: Identify yourself for the record, please. 3

PROCEEDINGS

MR. ALEMAN: Good morning, Mr. President, gentlemen of the council. My name is Narciso Aleman, A-l-e-m-a-n. I'm an attorney.

One of the professional hazards in our business, Mr. President, is that we can be hired on the porch steps right before the hearing, and this is the situation that I found myself in last night with Mr. Garcia. He asked me if I would represent him. I reviewed with him for two hours the records and the recommendations and the proceedings that had taken place.

I have had the opportunity to speak before the committee, and I have the utmost respect and regard for the committee members. They work long, long hours and take a great deal of time deliberating the issues before them, and some of them are very complex, and I applaud them for that. And so what I'm about to say and ask of the council to do is not done lightly, and is not done without consideration of the work and the effort of the committee members. All that we're asking for, Mr. President, gentlemen, is that Mr. Garcia be heard.

At the time that the notification of the committee hearing was sent out, Mr. Garcia and his family were in Mexico. They did not return until after the hearing. Consequently, he did not have

an opportunity to be heard.

And looking at his record, that was -- one of my clarifications to him was that, you know, you're a businessman. You've had a number of businesses for a number of years. This is not the first time, you know, you've had this. But he was in Mexico. He didn't have an opportunity to be heard, and that's all that we're asking, Mr. President, members of the council, is that he be heard before the committee.

If some of the things that are being said and recorded are accurate and truthful, perhaps the committee recommendation would be the same. But all that I'm asking is that we be heard, and certainly that is not a great deal to ask.

With all due respect to the proceedings and the timeliness aspect, that's another thing that I pointed out to Mr. Garcia. I said, if you had come to me three days ago, we could have had at least written objections filed within the time line, but you come to me right before the hearing, and now we're recruited for that. So the only thing left before us is to come

back to committee, and that we be given an opportunity 2 to be heard. Mr. President, gentlemen, thank you for your patience and your consideration. PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you. Are there any 5 questions of Attorney Aleman at this point in time? 6 Chair recognizes Alderman D'Amato, followed by 7 Alderman Bauman. 8 ALDERMAN D'AMATO: Thank you, Mr. President. 9 Sir, while Mr. Garcia was in Mexico, who operated his 10 establishment? 11 MR. ALEMAN: Well, I can ask him. Would you 12 like me to ask him? 13 ALDERMAN D'AMATO: Was there somebody in 14 charge or was it closed? 15 MR. ALEMAN: I can ask him that. 16 PRESIDENT HINES: We can call him up here 17 and ask him to respond to your questions. 18 (Whereupon Mr. Garcia was sworn under oath.) 19 MR. ALEMAN: He says that there is a 20 bartender that is of confidence that operates the 21 22 business while he's out of the country. ALDERMAN D'AMATO: And did that bartender 23 receive the notice as provided by the city? 24 MR. ALEMAN: The notice was sent to 25

22	MR. ALEMAN: No, there wasn't.
23	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: And was the mail left
24	at his home, or was the mail held by the post office?
25	MR. ALEMAN: When they came back, it was

piled, there was a pile of correspondence. 1 ALDERMAN BAUMAN: And on what day did 2 Mr. Garcia first realize that there had been a hearing 3 set before the Utilities and Licenses Committee? MR. ALEMAN: When he returned on the 11th. 5 ALDERMAN BAUMAN: That's all. F PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you, Alderman. Chair recognizes Alderman Puente. 8 I'd like to ask the 9 ALDERMAN PUENTE: attorney, when was the notice sent out? 10 PRESIDENT HINES: We can ask that question 11 of City Attorney Schrimpf. 12 13 ALDERMAN PUENTE: Oh, okay. PRESIDENT HINES: Are there any more 14 questions for Attorney Aleman? If not, thank you, 15 sir. Why don't you remain. The city attorney has a 16 17 question for you. MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. Aleman, for the record, 18 I would ask if there's going to be any effort on the 19 part of the licensee, or anyone on behalf of the 20 21 licensee, to operate the business by court order or any other kind of legal action, pending review of this 22 matter by the Utilities and Licenses Committee and the 23 Common Council. 24

MR. ALEMAN: The answer is that the business

is operating now. The license expires in December.

MR. SCHRIMPF: That's correct. December

17th. All right.

PRESIDENT HINES: Any additional questions?

Thank you. We will now hear from Assistant City

Attorney Schrimpf.

MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. President, members, it had originally been my intention to quickly review the Findings of Fact and the number of neighbors that appeared.

Whether or not you decide to remand it back to the committee to give the licensee an opportunity to be heard, in light of the fact that he was out of the country, is certainly something reposed to your sound discretion.

I would point out that neighbors did appear, they did testify, and they took time off their schedule in order to appear before the committee.

Basically what we're going to have to do is order a transcript of that hearing, and allow the licensee an opportunity to subpoena those witnesses back in if he wants to effectively cross-examine them. That is something that's not unheard of. The committee has done that before. But those are some

of the considerations that go into this.

Whether or not you send it back to committee to give the licensee an opportunity to defend the matter is, of course, something reposed to your sound discretion.

PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you. Are there any questions? Alderman D'Amato has a question for Attorney Schrimpf.

ALDERMAN D'AMATO: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. Schrimpf, in your experience working on behalf of the committee in the past, have you had occasion to go to court for items with regard to notice, if somebody was out of the country or out of town; and if you have, what were those conclusions?

MR. SCHRIMPF: No, I've never -- None of those cases have ever gone into court.

ALDERMAN D'AMATO: Thank you.

PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you. The Chair recognizes Alderman Zielinski.

ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: I'd like the Assistant City Attorney to read off the list of violations.

MR. SCHRIMPF: March 19th, '98, gambling machine; November 27th, 1998, a fight on the premises; December 26th, 1998, theft of a patron/property;

January 31st, 1999, presence of underage --

PRESIDENT HINES: Alderman, I think it's a valid question, but that was why we were given the Findings of Facts, and I think there was testimony in support of that, so I would think we could go into the Committee of the Whole. I mean what's the point, Alderman?

ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: Well, the point is -My concern is that if it takes so long to read the
history of problems in this building is, you know, -It just raises some serious concerns on my part.

PRESIDENT HINES: Point well taken, and we appreciate that. Any additional questions? Chair recognizes Alderman Puente.

ALDERMAN PUENTE: Yes. My original question was -- Thank you, Mr. President. When was the notice sent?

MR. SCHRIMPF: I'm sorry, Alderman. I meant to address that. The original notice was sent on November the 3rd of 2004, which if I understood the licensee's testimony correctly, is the day he left the country.

ALDERMAN PUENTE: I believe he left the 5th.

MR. SCHRIMPF: Thank you.

PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you. Are there any additional questions or comments? The Chair
