WHEREAS, *Aoife Scott is a true veteran of the Irish & Folk Festival circuit, having performed and headlined at dozens of festivals across multiple continents and countries, including Australia, India, Ireland, France, the United Kingdom and the United States; and*

WHEREAS, *Aoife Scott has appeared on BBC2, performing live from Celtic Connections in Scotland, among many other TV and media appearances, and she currently appears every Sunday night in Ireland on national TV channel TG4 on the show “Realta & Gaolta” and presented live music performance show “The Windmill Lane Sessions”; and*

WHEREAS, *Aoife Scott’s accolades in 2018 have seen her named Best Folk Act at the Irish Post Music Awards (Ireland) and Emerging Artist of the Year at the Live Ireland Awards (U.S.), and her single “Atlantic Way” also hit #1 slot and was also named “Song of the Year” at the Irish Folk Music Awards in 2017; now, therefore, be it*
