### Program Goals

The Milwaukee Police Department Intelligence Fusion Center (IFC) integrated video system is an important part of the IFC's regular situational awareness and information sharing capacity. Particularly so, during incidents where partners actively participate in an activated Intelligence Operations Center (IOC) environment, they are able to view real-time information and intelligence that assists in their decision making, planning, coordination, and response efforts. This equipment will provide decision makers the ability to conduct unified planning related to major incidents in an IOC environment.

### Programmatic Summary

The Southeastern WI Threat Analysis Center (STAC) is currently one of 78 Fusion Centers recognized by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. However, STAC is currently not funded by the Department of Homeland Security. STAC is one of two centers in the State of Wisconsin with an area of responsibility that covers Southeastern Wisconsin. While facility and personnel costs are covered by the Milwaukee Police Department, specialized equipment and technology are not. Without grant funding many of the STAC's capabilities will be lost.
