

Fire Department

Between January 1, 2011 and June 30, 2011, the Milwaukee Fire Department (MFD) reported seven fire fatalities. During this same time period, MFD made 1,682 fire responses, 3,899 rescue responses, and 600 service responses.

During the first six months of 2011, MFD responded to 12,806 ALS (Advanced Life Support) calls and 14,330 BLS (Basic Life Support) calls. MFD personnel made contact with 52,778 individuals regarding fire safety and distributed 479 smoke detectors to households that did not have a working smoke detector.

Police Department

Between January 1, 2011 and March 31, 2011, the Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) reported a 9.8% decrease in violent crime and a 15.4% decrease in property crime compared to the first three months of 2010. All violent crimes, except for rape, decreased, and all property crimes, except for auto theft, also decreased.

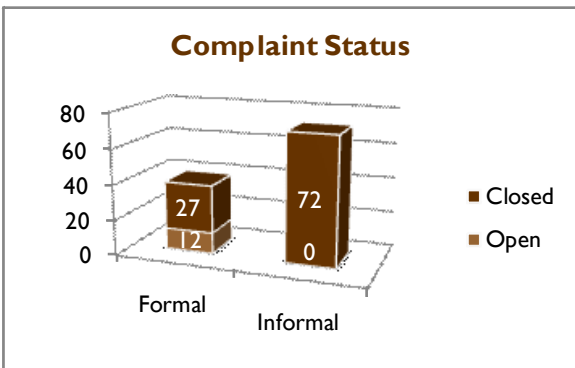

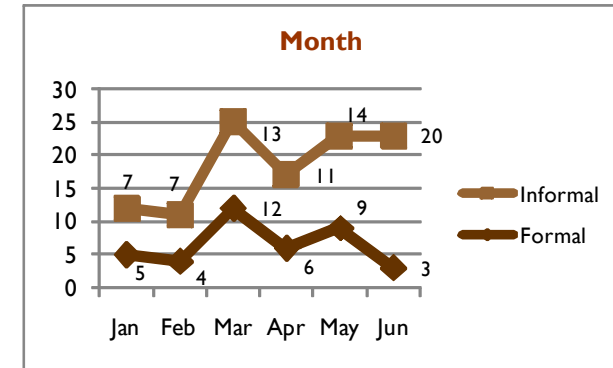
- Beginning January 1, 2011, the Fire and Police Commission (FPC) assumed responsibility for the recruitment and hiring of public safety employees.
- FPC staff attended the first NACOLE (National Association for Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement) Midwest Regional Conference in Chicago, Illinois.
- Between January 1, 2011 and June 30, 2011, 72 informal complaints and 39 formal complaints were filed with the FPC. In comparison, during the first six months of 2010, 103 informal complaints and 43 formal complaints were filed.
- Of the 111 complaints filed thus far in 2011, 12 formal complaints were open and remained under investigation, while 27 formal complaints were closed. All 72 informal complaints were closed.



- The most common formal complaint allegations included discourtesy and department procedures; while the most common informal complaint allegations included discourtesy, department procedures, and department services.

- One formal complaint and three informal complaints were filed against employees of the Milwaukee Fire Department (MFD). Thirty-eight formal complaints and 69 informal complaints were against employees of the Milwaukee Police Department (MPD).
- March, with 25 total complaints, and May and June, with 23 total complaints each, were the months with the most complaints filed.



- Police District 7, with 6 formal complaints and 23 informal complaints, was the district with the most complaints.
