File #021704 is a substitute ordinance relating to parking regulations for street sweeping operations.

Background

- In order to increase the effectiveness of the City's street sweeping operations, the Common Council adopted, on April 23,2002, an ordinance (File#021704) creating a pilot street sweeping program in certain areas of the 3rd and 14th Aldermanic Districts.
- 2. The pilot program ordinance prohibited parking on designated streets within the pilot area between the hours of 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. on the first or third Wednesday of the month so the streets could be swept. The ordinance provided for the ticketing and the towing of vehicles.
- 3. On October 15, 2002, the Common Council removed areas in the 14th Aldermanic District that had been included in the pilot street sweeping program (File #020795).
- 4. The pilot street sweeping program ordinance expired on November 30, 2002.
- 5. The table below shows the number of citations issued by DPW parking under the pilot street sweeping program.

Discussion

- 1. The ordinance authorizes the designation of streets on which parking between certain hours is prohibited in order to provide for street sweeping operations. Additional legislation is required to designate specific streets and the hours parking is prohibited. It has been proposed that certain streets in the 3rd Aldermanic District be designated to fall under this ordinance.
- 2. The ordinance imposes the forfeiture of \$30 for citations for parking not in compliance with parking regulations on designated street sweeping streets.
- 3. The ordinance authorizes the ticketing and towing of motor vehicles not parked in compliance with the parking regulations on designated street sweeping streets. (The vehicle reclamation charge for a towed vehicle is \$95 and \$20 for each day of storage.)

Fiscal Impact

 According to the fiscal note submitted by the Department of Public Works (DPW), the ordinance will generate \$240,400 in net Parking Fund revenue; provide \$2,881 in operational savings to DPW's Operations Division; and increase expenditures by \$45,000 in DPW's Infrastructure Services Division. DPW's estimate of the ordinances fiscal impact is shown in the table on page 3.
