Milwaukee AIDS Initiative 2003-2004

ARCW MSM \$41,300/Yr

The MSM program provides comprehensive HIV prevention programming to reduce new infections among men who have sex with men (MSM) in Milwaukee through outreach to gay bars, public sex environments (PSEs) and the Internet.

ARCW Lifepoint \$60,000/Yr

Lifepoint provides comprehensive HIV prevention services to injection drug users (IDUs) The program includes: HIV risk reduction counseling; distribution of HIV risk reduction materials; one-for-one exchange of needles; skill building; drug use and abuse assessment and referral; harm reduction-based drug treatment; HIV and HCV counseling and testing; and referrals for HIV and non-HIV related health and social services.

NOTE: Contract money will **not** be used to purchase needles

Milwaukee LGBT Center \$50,000/Yr

Project Q is a youth development and HIV prevention program that serves high-risk young men who have sex with men. The program provides prevention case management, individual and group level interventions aimed at decreasing the number of new HIV infections among the population.

House of Infiniti \$58,900/Yr

The House of Infiniti provides HIV prevention interventions and outreach to at-risk African American men who have sex with men and are currently expanding services to address the needs of the transgender community. The program provides group interventions and outreach through bars and a telephone hotline.

The Counseling Center of Milwaukee \$52,000/Yr

Women-to-Women is a peer-based HIV Prevention Program helping low-income, at-risk African American and Hispanic women acquire the skills, knowledge, and self-assurance to reduce their risk of HIV infection. The majority of their populations are either incarcerated, living in residential AODA treatment facilities or in homeless/domestic violence shelter. They are also expanding services to provide programming for teen girls, ages 11-17.

Latino Health Coalition \$52,000/Yr

This program provides comprehensive HIV prevention programming to partners of IDUs. By providing HIV prevention information and risk reduction counseling, the goal is to prevent HIV transmission and turning to drug use.
