





Other Zips were in the Milwaukee Area







"This is such a bizarre area to drive in - not sure how the future attends to that aspect. Wondering what catalytic project is planned for the shopping center area N of Whitnall[?]"




Aerotropolis Concept

Aerotropolis Milwaukee is a vibrant and diverse transportation and commercial hub, a globally recognized economic engine that attracts business and people to the Milwaukee region

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


The Aerotropolis Milwaukee Development Plan

What could an Aerotropolis look like around MKE?

The Challenge:

- "Aerotropolis" is somewhat conceptual what can realistically be achieved in Milwaukee?
- Much of the land around MKE is already developed but there are significant redevelopment opportunities and areas that are still undeveloped
- Every affected community already has its own plans and projects within its boundaries—this plan helps to coordinate efforts around a shared vision of airport-oriented economic development



 Height and other restrictions on development near the Airport need to be identified and considered when planning for growth



The Aerotropolis Milwaukee Development Plan

What is the purpose of the plan?

- Establish a shared vision and coordinated effort to capitalize on the Airport in order to enhance the quality of life, stimulate economic investment, and promote job growth in surrounding communities
- Plan provides a valuable guide for developing the areas surrounding the Airport, maximizing the area's considerable economic growth potential





The Aerotropolis Milwaukee Development Plan

How is the plan organized?

- Land Use Recommendations
 - Identify where future airport-oriented growth should be encouraged, focused on redevelopment and achieving an efficient development pattern
 - Six Aerotropolis Growth Areas with catalytic projects in each area
 - Brings together existing local comprehensive plans and suggests modest changes
- Transportation Recommendations
 - Infrastructure and service improvements to achieve a high-quality, multimodal transportation system to serve the six Growth Areas
 - Primarily derived from VISION 2050 and refined for the Aerotropolis area
 - Focused on maximizing connectivity between aerotropolis-supporting land uses


AEROTROPOLIS GROWTH AREAS

- Close to Airport



Layton Town Center Area


Vision: Premier Aerotropolis hospitality and retail corridor co-existing alongside a high-caliber manufacturing and freight movement center





Layton/Lake Parkway Area


Vision: Retail corridor complementary to Layton Town Center, including mixed-use development, office space, and advancement of a food and beverage manufacturing district





MKE South Industrial Area


Vision: Airport-oriented employment center featuring several concentrated industrial parks, including one with unique inside-the-fence access to MKE, and a distribution and logistics hub





13th/27th Street Area

Vision: Regional destination featuring high-value mixed-use corridors with uses that serve visitors while also creating a desirable atmosphere to work and live near the Airport





Next Steps

- With modest changes to communities' comprehensive plans and zoning, implementing these plans will achieve the vision for Aerotropolis Milwaukee
- The Gateway to Milwaukee and SEWRPC staff are working with each community to determine how best to endorse the plan and incorporate its recommendations into their respective plans
 - Six of nine communities have already endorsed
- City of Milwaukee DCD staff are proposing to update the City's Southeast
 Side Area Plan to incorporate the Aerotropolis plan recommendations
