This is to put the Wisconsin Labor History Society on record as supporting the Resolution of Ald. James Bohl to implement the recommendations of the City Hall Historical Exhibit Work Group to create exhibits and a museum to commemorate the construction of Milwaukee's magnificent City Hall.
