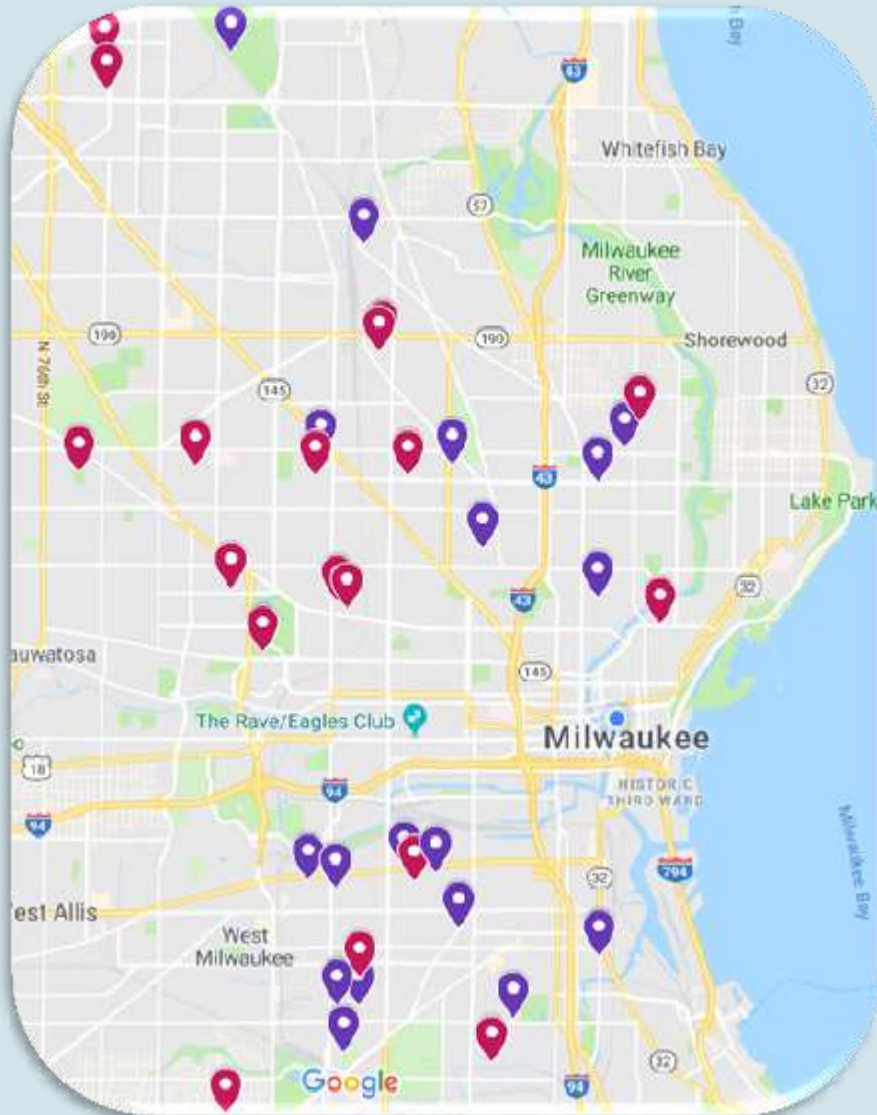

NIDC RESOURCES

- Common Council allocated funds to NIDC for implementation of Healthy Neighborhoods CIPs and Citywide CIPs:
- 36 projects were approved in 2017 for over \$128,251 leveraging more than \$201,260
- Funding is available to operate the program at the same level in 2018
