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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Back on the
3	record. Ari Domnitz, Agent for "Bar Louie Water
4	Street, Incorporated, Class "B" Tavern renewal
5	application for "Bar Louie" at 1114 North Water
6	Street. Good afternoon.
7	THE APPLICANT: Good afternoon.
8	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Could you raise
9	your right hand? We'll swear you in.
10	(Whereupon the Applicants were sworn.)
11	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Your name and
12	address for the record, please.
13	THE APPLICANT: Ari Domnitz. I live at
14	5432 North Iroquois Avenue in Glendale,
15	Wisconsin.
16	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And you are?
17	MS. DENNIS: Rachel Dennis on behalf of
18	Bar Louie Water Street and Bar Louie America,
19	General Counsel and Vice-President.
20	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okav. And?
21	MR. WARD: Scott Ward on behalf of Bar
22	Louie, Vice-President.
23	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Let me get
2.4	1 5
25	to the notice here. Do you admit to receiving a
20	notice in the mail that there's a possibility

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1	your application could be denied due to items
2	contained on the police report and neighborhood
3	objections?
4	THE APPLICANT: Yes, I do.
5	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Health
6	Department?
7	HEALTH: Health Department has no
8	objection.
9	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Neighborhood
10	Services.
11	DNS: No objections.
12	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Sergeant, the
13	police report, please?
14	SERGEANT ULICKEY: On 2/21 of '07 at
15	1:44 a.m. Milwaukee police were dispatched to
16	1114 North Water Street for a battery complaint.
17	Officers observed the victim bleeding profusely
18	from his mouth. Officers observed the victim to
19	be covered in blood and that his lip was split in
20	half. The victim stated that two bouncers had
21	beaten him inside of the bar. Officers obtained
22	descriptions from the victim, and entered the
23	tavern to locate the bouncers. Officers found
24	the bouncers identified as Michael Phillips and
25	Lavatar Griffin, with Phillips admitting to

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1	having an altercation with the victim. Victim -
2	- Or Phillips stated that the victim refused to
3	leave the tavern, and when asked to leave or
4	when asked to leave at closing time. Phillips
5	stated the victim got into his face and shoved
6	him. Phillips then stated the victim swung at
7	him, and he had to defend himself. The fight
8	ended up on the bar floor, and Griffin came over
9	to help get the victim under control. Phillips
10	stated that the Once the victim was outside
11	the bar, he noticed blood on himself, and
12	realized the victim must have been cut. Officers
13	observed no blood anywhere in the bar for the
14	amount that the victim was bleeding outside.
15	When asked about the scene inside the bar, the
16	manager, identified as Nancy Morgan, stated her
17	staff cleaned the blood immediately. Officers
18	also observed both Phillips and Griffin had no
19	blood on them. And after they both admitted to
20	having blood on them from the fight. Both
21	Griffin and Phillips stated they had washed up
22	immediately after afterwards. When asked
23	they would clean up the bar, knowing police were
24	called, they responded they didn't want any of
25	the customers seeing it, or stepping in it on the

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1	way out. The victim received 11 stitches to
2	close the wound, and that officers arrested both
3	security guards for substantial battery due to
4	the seriousness of the victim's injury. A check
5	CCAP revealed no charges were issued.
6	On 6/3 of '07 at 10:45 p.m. Milwaukee
7	police investigated dis a disturbance at the
8	Bar Louie, 1114 North Water Street.
9	Investigation revealed a patron was upset over
10	food despite several attempts by management to
11	correct the problem. The patron continued to
12	yell and curse, causing a disturbance. The
13	manager even asked the patron to leave, and she
14	refused, continuing to cause a disturbance.
15	Patron was escorted out the bar by an employee
16	identified as John Davis, who was observed by
17	police to have several scratches on his face.
18	Davis stated to officers that as he was escorting
19	the patron out of the bar, she scratched him
20	several times in the face and also bit him.
21	Officers issued a citation to the patron for
22	assault and battery.
23	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Any questions
24	about the police report?
25	THE APPLICANT: No.

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1	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: No. Food's not
2	that bad there, is it?
3	THE APPLICANT: It's excellent.
4	ALDERMAN WADE: Mr. Chair.
5	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: I couldn't resist
6	that. Alderman Wade.
7	ALDERMAN WADE: Do these two gentleman
8	need to stay with us, or?
9	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: One more
10	MR. SCHRIMPF: There is, yeah.
11	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Yeah, the
12	beginning of the next hearing, then we then
13	we can Well, I don't know. We'll think about
14	excusing the
15	MS. BARRON: They don't have any
16	information on the next application.
17	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Pardon?
18	MS. BARRON: They don't have any
19	information on the next item.
20	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Oh, they don't.
21	Well, then you are excused at this time. Thank
22	you for your service today.
23	DNS AND HEALTH: Thank you, Mr.
24	Chairman.
25	ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman.

00007 1 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Bohl. 2 ALDERMAN BOHL: What was - - What, if 3 anything, was done with the - - the two bouncers 4 that were involved in incident number one? 5 THE APPLICANT: After they were 6 released from jail they were terminated. We - -7 We did a training seminar immediately after the incident in the - - in the location, brought in 8 9 an off - - off-duty police officer, retrained the 10 entire staff on how to handle any kind of 11 situations. Reviewed our door host policy 12 procedures. 13 ALDERMAN BOHL: I'm assuming that - -14 that - - and I commend you on - - on going through that process. But I think that is 15 16 as much tantamount to a realization that this is 17 issue was not handled properly by your - - by 18 your staff. 19 THE APPLICANT: Right. 20 ALDERMAN BOHL: Let me - - I'll - -21 Otherwise, if you want to tell me no, I'm going 22 to ask you that if I get into an argument, your 23 staff ought to punch me, whether or not I 24 threaten them or not. 25 THE APPLICANT: Agreed. And they're

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1	not allowed to put a hand on on any customer
2	or employee.
3	MS. DENNIS: We will mention that was
4	against our policy and procedure.
5	ALDERMAN BOHL: I'll tell you despite
6	anything else, if you haven't been sued, you're
7	lucky you weren't sued.
8	THE APPLICANT: Correct.
9	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: I'm sure they're not.
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And can I just see
11	a show of hands? Is there anyone here in the
12	audience here to testify to Bar Louie at 1114
13	North Water Street, other than the people at the
14	table. Let the record show no one acknowledges
15	that question. Alderman Bauman?
16	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: Yeah, thank you, Mr.
17	Chair. The relevant issue here is, while this is
18	obviously an incident, it speaks for itself. And
19	admitted there was a problem with the bouncers.
20	They were terminated. I would generally consider
21	that a closed case. The problem is that they
22	renewed late, and they're going to have a
23	substantial period when they're going to have
24	be able to serve no liquor. No matter what we
25	do. Correct, Ms. Barron?

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1	MS. BARRON: That's correct.
2	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: And that They
3	don't appear to understand that, and I think
4	they're here under the assumption that somehow we
5	could magically make exceptions to the procedural
6	deadlines and the statutory deadlines, which both
7	State Statute and our ordinances contain, and we
8	cannot. Because they applied late for renewal
9	and because there was a incident on the record,
10	whatever it related whatever its merits
11	were
12	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Puts them in a
13	different category.
14	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: puts them at
15	risk, and maybe Ms. Barron can explain it more
16	fully, because obviously I'm not going to request
17	any draconian discipline based on this one issue.
18	I've been in the establishment. It seems to be a
19	well run establishment. That's not the issue.
20	The issue is they're going to not be able to
21	serve liquor from sometime in July until August
22	6th. Correct?
23	MS. BARRON: September 5th.
2.4	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: September 5th.
25	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Ms. Barron, would
20	Similaria, Milkowink, 115, Bullon, Would

00010 1 you - - would you explain this? 2 MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. Chairman, Alderman, 3 and Ms. Barron. Counsel and I, while we were 4 taking a break, I explained it to them. And we 5 went through the ordinances and the Statutes and, yeah, they - - It's absolutely true. They filed 6 7 on July - - I think it was July the 5th. 8 MS. BARRON: July 5th. 9 MR. SCHRIMPF: Therefore, because - -10 The committee can go ahead and hold the hearing, 11 and you're doing that. That's fine. But the 12 Council cannot, by ordinance and by Chapter 125, 13 go ahead and take up the recommendation of this 14 committee, whatever it is, presuming it's some 15 kind of a renewal, until on and after September 16 5th, which is the next meeting of the - - of the 17 Common Council because of the effect of the 18 August break. 19 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And do you 20 understand that? 21 THE APPLICANT: We do now. This - -22 This came obviously when I - - when I received 23 the notice at the office. It came to light that 24 an employee of ours didn't follow protocol when 25 the license procedure - - procedure went through, 00011 1 and when I read it and found out the seriousness 2 of the situation, terminated yet another 3 employee, the one with the liquor license issues, 4 and grabbed counsel here as of last week and 5 strategized to come here and deal with the issue 6 head-on. 7 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: So you understand 8 that, I mean, even if we had a magic wand and 9 waved it, we couldn't make anything happen here 10 that - - that would get you that renewal any 11 sooner? 12 MS. DENNIS: Well, respectfully, I 13 understand that the - - the law requires you to 14 wait 30 days from the renewal application, which 15 was filed - - or received here July 5th. 16 Therefore, I would say August 5th or after you 17 would be able to grant the renewal application. 18 So I - - I know that legally you can do that on 19 August 5th. If there's a scheduling problem, 20 that's not a legal problem. 21 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Yeah, I mean, but 22 the problem is we're off in August. That's - -So that's - -23 MR. SCHRIMPF: Right. 24 25 ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman.

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1	MS. DENNIS: And apparently so are we.
2	ALDERMAN BOHL: They're They're
3	welcome to to talk with the Council President
4	who has the ability to call, though, that he's
5	made an internal policy not to do that. It's
6	It has been done in the past, where the Council
7	President has the authority to probably take,
8	garner a
9	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Quorum.
10	ALDERMAN BOHL: quorum.
11	MR. SCHRIMPF: Let me explain. My
12	understanding of that, Mr. Chairman, is that if
13	the Council is going to be taking up business
14	during the August break for other reasons, then
15	it's possible to trailer a recommendation of the
16	licenses committee on that. But if there's no
17	other business before the Council during the
18	August break, then I I agree. I think the
19	policy is not to schedule during the August
20	break.
21	ALDERMAN BOHL: But it's solely the
22	discretion of the Council President.
23	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. But now we
24	all understand the reality of this, right.
25	THE APPLICANT: Yes.

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1	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okav.
2	ALDERMAN WITKOWSKI: Mr. Chair, just to
3	point out that it's policy not just for the
4	August break, but it's the policy not to schedule
5	a special meeting of the Council for license
6	matters.
7	ALDERMAN BOHL: Yes. That's
8	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Yeah, that's
9	correct.
10	ALDERMAN BOHL: But that is the policy
11	of this President. It hasn't been the policy of
12	past presidents.
13	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Right. Okay. Any
14	other questions by members of the committee?
15	Anything further to say?
16	MS. DENNIS: Who is the Council
17	President, and how do I speak to that person?
18	Thank you very much.
19	ALDERMAN PUENTE: So, Mr. Chair.
20	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Yes, Alderman
21	Puente.
22	ALDERMAN PUENTE: So if it goes the way
23	that it's right now, how many days will they be
24	out of business?
25	MS. DENNIS: Well, based on

2	ALDERMAN PUENTE: How many?
3	ALDERMAN POENIE. HOW Many: ALDERMAN BOHL: 36.
4	ALDERMAN PUENTE: Okay. Thank you.
5	MS. BARRON: July 30th to September
6	5th.
7	ALDERMAN PUENTE: Okay. Thank you.
8	THE APPLICANT: 320,000 dollars in
9	volume.
10	MS. BARRON: That's why I would just
11	note that we send out multiple notices to people
12	when they're supposed to file, that we did send
13	an application.
14	THE APPLICANT: We screwed up. That
15	employee screwed up, and was terminated.
16	MS. BARRON: And we go through the
17	Council calendar so that we don't put anyone in
18	this situation ourselves.
19	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: We'll have some
20	Coca-Coca promotions. Alderman Bohl?
21	ALDERMAN BOHL: At this point, I'll
22	move approval of the renewal with the issuance of
23	a warning letter.
