### 1. Review and approval of the minutes of the July 26th Meeting.

*Mr. Miller moved approval of the July 26th minutes. There were no objections.*

### 2. Department of Neighborhood Services Update

#### *Individuals present:*

*Tom Mishefski - Dept. of Neighborhood Services*

*Sharon Blando - Dept. of Neighborhood Services*

*Ms. Blando referred the committee members to the Graffiti Incidents Reported to the Department of Neighborhood Services (DNS) Hotline graphs to prove that graffiti has decreases from 2009 - 2010. Static showed that graffiti is going down to the more average type numbers. Ms. Blando projects that for the year 2010, the graffiti incidents reported to the Hotline will be around the 5000 in number. The use of the volunteers and operation payback participants (started since 2008), have been a great impact in the graffiti removal efforts. The garbage and recycling carts are still being done by the St. Benedict Center.*

*Ms. Blando said that the taggers in the last three years have changed tremendously. There was one tagger that was arrested as a juvenile. Recently his name came across a court case and he was arrested as an adult. Ms. Blando explained that the east side has 30% of the city graffiti from Farwell to N. 35 St., Locust to Juneau, 50% of the graffiti comes from south 1st Street/ Kinnickinnic Ave. to S. 35th Street and Pierce to Howard. The remaining graffiti is throughout the city. She said that the graffiti in the south side has increased in regards to gang communication.*

*Ms. Blando also said that this year the department was funded higher than last year. These funds have enable DNS to increase the number of contractors for clean up efforts. DNS is applying educational efforts for the adults and advocating for the we tip hotline, published on the back of the Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) buses.*

*DNS purchased pressure washer from The National Ace Hardware that are used by operation payback and other volunteers to be able to remove graffiti from cement and block concrete areas that DNS was not able to remove before. The Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) did host a training provided by National Ace Hardware. These machines will be stored at MPD District #2 garage.*

*Ald. Zielinski asked Ms. Blando if there are any other initiatives that have helped the decrease of graffiti removal.*

*Ms. Blando said that there is a new Business Improvement District in the south side that has really made an impact in the Bay view area. They removed an incredible amount of graffiti.*

*Ms. Mishefski added that there has been a very substantial coordinated effort on behalf of a number of entities to tackled graffiti this year. The Common Council and the Mayor have made appropriated additional funds to enabled DNS to be proactive in the clean up of graffiti.*

Always working off the list provided through the graffiti hotline, Aldermnaic complaints and requests receive from the Call center..Mr. Novotny said that the hot spots have been the east side and the near south side.*

*Mr. Edward explained to the committee that Safe and Sound Anti-Graffiti initiative called "Operation Payback" possible through a close collaboration with the Milwaukee Police Department District 2 and District 5.*

*The latest update Operation Pyaback efforts resulted in the removal of 500 instances of graffiti and 10,000 square feet of tags and/or gang related graffiti removed, also. Safe and Sound holds weekly meetings with the Community Liaison Officer (CLO) to tackle different areas with graffiti removal, garbage clean up and garage numbering with the operation pay back offender that, as of right now have logged in 460 hours of clean up.*

*Ms. Sandoval thank Ms. Blando for her involvement with the organization also added that without the grant that Safe and Sound received from CDBG fundings has contributed to making the initiatives a success.*

*Ms. Sandoval distributed the Safe and Sound Anti-Graffiti September Update as part of their presentation.*

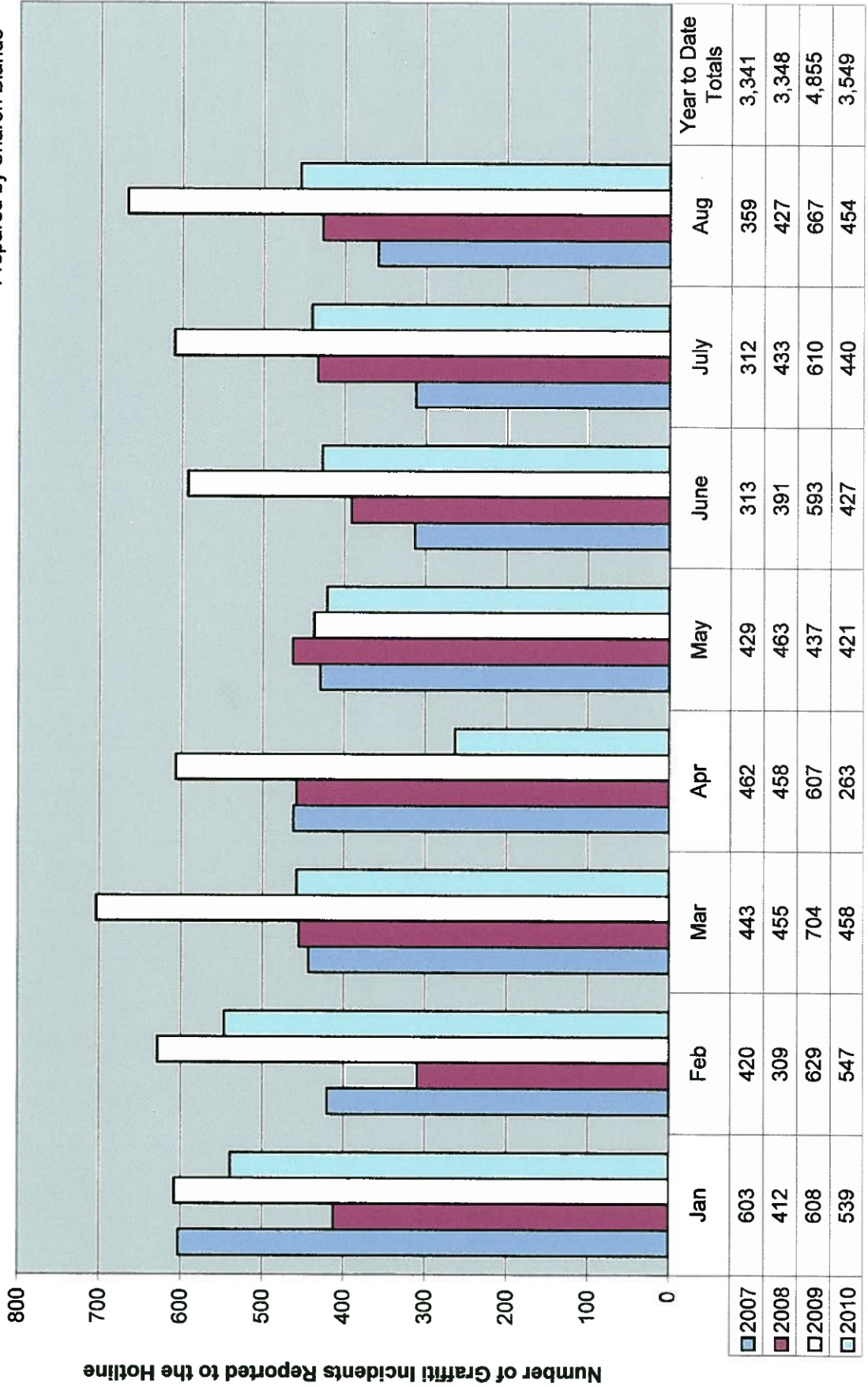

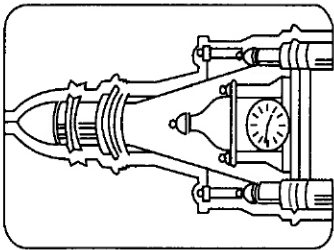

**Year to Date Totals by Month January through August 2007 to 2010**

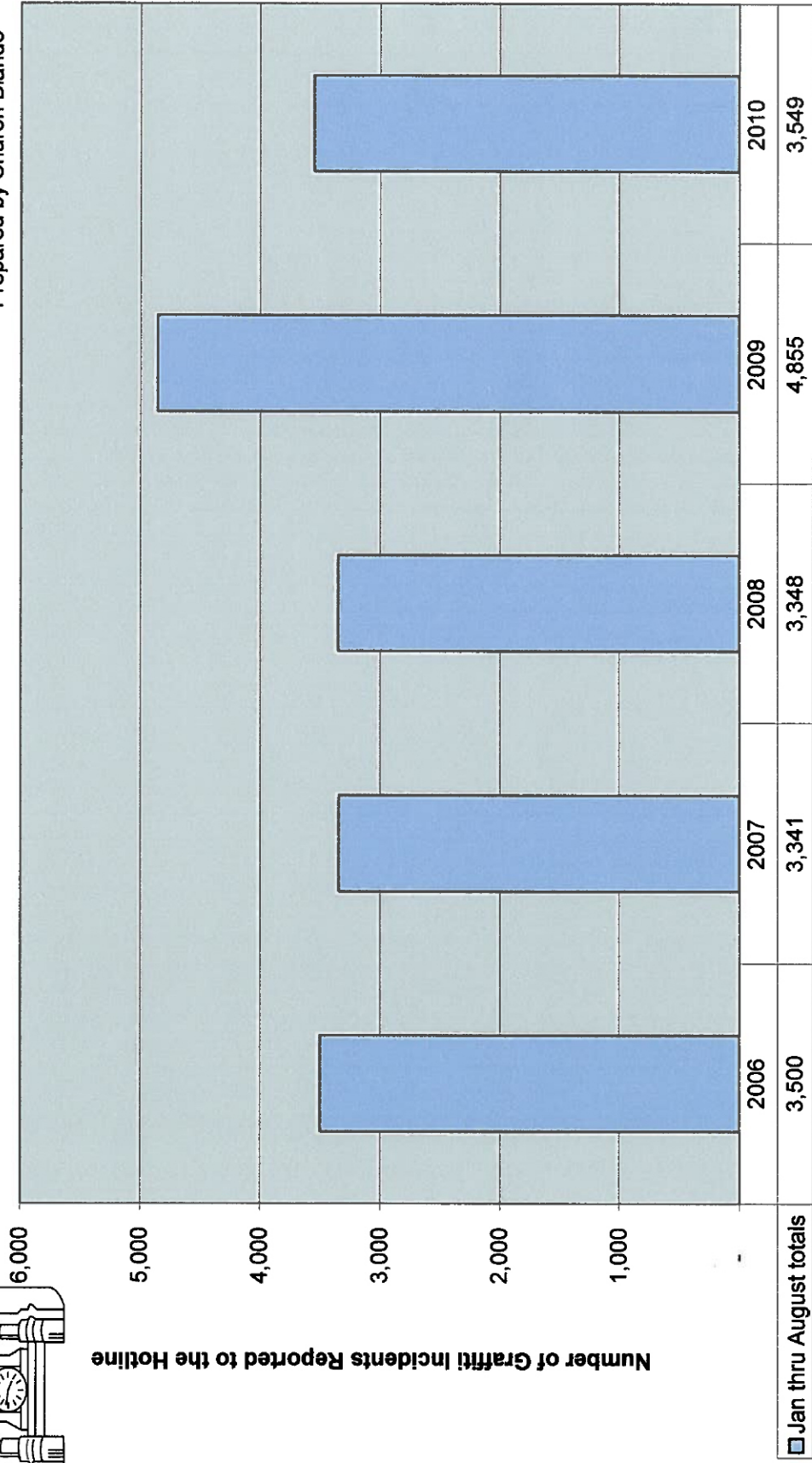

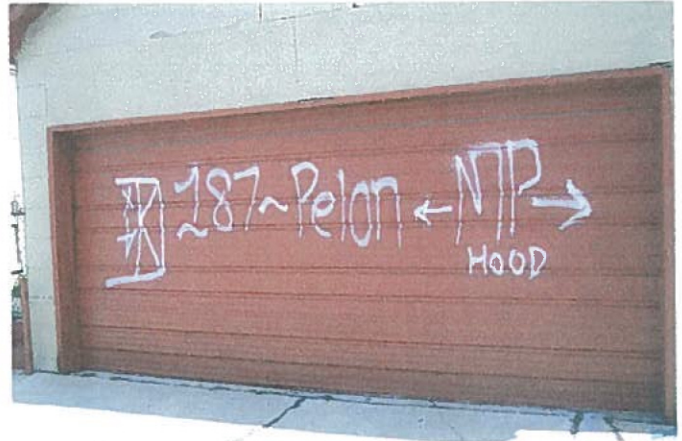
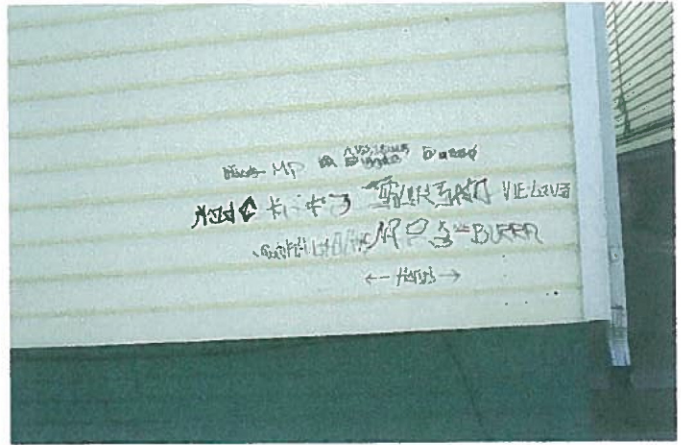

First, I would like to apologize for the delay in providing this report for the Committee's review. We have taken steps to ensure that this does not happen in the future.

Attached for your information is the summary of vandalism and graffiti-related ordinance violations that includes information through August 31, 2010. In addition to the standard report, I have provided more a detailed listing of cases for Avandalism-graffiti related@ offenses and for cases relating to sale and possession of spray paint/wide tip markers. You will note that several of the juvenile cases have a guilty verdict but have no monetary judgment noted. This is because the juvenile was found guilty by default (they did not appear in court) and a juvenile warrant was issued for their arrest. A monetary judgment will be applied when they appear before the judge.

### Safe & Sound Anti-Graffiti September Update

The Safe & Sound Anti-Graffiti Initiative called "Operation Payback" utilizes community service workers, residents, and youth groups to conduct educational anti-graffiti outreach and "graffiti wipe-out" events. The initiative is possible through a close collaboration with the Milwaukee Police Department District 2 and District 5, Probation and Parole, Community Prosecution Unit Teams, the Department of Neighborhood Services and other community based organizations. Safe & Sound Community Partners has strived to sustain this collaborative graffiti removal effort year round for three years. The \$20,000 in CDBG funding received in 2010 has contributed to making this initiative a success.

In just the month of August Operation Payback efforts resulted in the removal of 39 instances of graffiti totaling 2,350 square feet of graffiti using chemicals and paint. Anti-graffiti outreach materials were discussed with residents and businesses during the sessions. Of the 39 graffiti instances, 35 were recorded as tagging and 4 instances were as a result of gang graffiti. Graffiti removal was conducted by over 86 volunteers serving 198 combined hours of service on 6 separate occasions in our community. A total of 120 hours were served by former offenders through Operation Payback, paying back their community through court ordered or agent mandated service hours. To date, graffiti removal has surpassed 10,000 square feet far exceeding 2010 projections.

Community Partner Supervisor Tim Schermetzler organized two collaborative sessions of Operation Payback with volunteers from Manpower Professionals on August 24<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>. A press conference at 23<sup>rd</sup> and Nash kicked-off the two sessions in order to draw greater attention to the ongoing law enforcement and community building efforts occurring in the MPD target area. Offenders were matched up with Manpower volunteers and the groups worked together to paint over the graffiti and complete other neighborhood beautification projects. Similar relationships are being developed with Marquette University and other area businesses.

Restorative Justice exercises are being conducted after community service sessions by Safe & Sound AmeriCorps VISTA and Restorative Justice Coordinator Daanika Gordon. She is helping the group relate more closely with the community they are serving and reflect on the importance of their work. For example, at the end of the service experience Manpower employees described their business to community service workers and Probation and Parole discussed some of the struggles ex-offenders face finding employment and trying to re-establish themselves in the community. It was a give-and-take of experience and understanding that everyone hopes will result in better solutions, including more targeted resource provision and recruitment for those seeking employment and for companies trying to fill positions. In this way, Operation Payback achieves much more than wiping-out graffiti, this project emphasizes the importance of a multi-faceted approach to creating safe neighborhoods by involving law enforcement efforts with service to the community by residents, CBOs and businesses.

## Manpower Joins Operation Payback for Community Service Efforts

Manpower employees volunteered for community service with young men and women from Operation Payback. They hit the neighborhood around 24th and Nash and an area in Riverwest and together the team cleaned up garbage, cut overgrown brush, added alley addresses on garages, and a fair amount of graffiti during the two days of service.

Before going into the alleys the group had a moment of reflection on the work at hand and community service. Daanika Gordon, Safe & Sound VISTA volunteer and Restorative Justice Coordinator, set the tempo and tone of the service experience by facilitating a participant Circle and round of questions. Once people have a better understanding and perspective on the service it makes the work more meaningful. After the short Circle everyone felt inspired and ready to take on alleys that need a lot of sweat and attention.

The Milwaukee Police Department works side-by-side with Operation Payback, but in the area of 24th and Nash they are primarily dedicated to their intensive enforcement efforts. Increasing violence and criminal nuisance problems, including drug dealing, gang and gun activity, are the focus of the policing efforts. The neighborhood improvement initiatives like Operation Payback are even more urgent with the City of Milwaukee investing over \$13 Million dollars to re-develop the Tower Automotive site. They will welcome a new manufacturer, Talgo, to the community. The efforts of law enforcement, CBOs, residents and Safe & Sound to reduce crime and improve the quality of life in the neighborhood are critical to the success of the Tower site.

Riverworks and Northside CDC staff were on hand as well as a number of neighborhood youth who joined in the clean-up efforts. Many older residents came out of their homes to talk with Safe & Sound staff and law enforcement to learn more about the program and the overall efforts to improve the United West Neighborhood. Manpower employees had the opportunity to meet residents and past offenders and gained a better understanding of needs and challenges of the local community. Afterwards, the team enjoyed refreshments and watched a District 5 roll call. The Chief addressed the officers emphasizing the importance of the work of law enforcement in close coordination with the community. It is efforts like Operation Payback that accomplish exactly this; bringing the community and law enforcement together to learn from each other while working together for a positive change in the community.
