The Roseville Police Department employs five part-time, temporary community service officers. Called CSO's, these employees are usually law enforcement students.

The department depends heavily on CSO support. Patrol relies on the CSO's to make minor criminal and non-criminal reports, patrol city parks, issue administrative tickets, assist officers at traffic accidents, medicals, crime scenes, and special community events.

The Roseville Police Department CSO's are also the Animal Control officers for Roseville. The CSO's issue administrative tickets for animal control violations, impound animals and investigate complaints made about animals throughout Roseville.

CSO's assist at the police department's front counter. While at the front counter, the CSO's are responsible for answering phones, assisting customers, and performing computerized records searches.

The CSO's are a valuable resource for the police department and the community. The CSO program is also a wonderful training tool and learning opportunity for students who are considering law enforcement as a career. And, at the same time, the CSO provides the Department an excellent recruitment base.
