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Our kitchen is currently located in an addition that was added in the 90s. There are two windows in the kitchen that we would like to update with new wooden windows, Pella Architect Series-Traditional Wood, that are the same size as the current ones. The one above the sink that is west facing toward the garage would stay in its existing location. The one that faces the south, would be moved approximately 2' to the east. The current location of the window prohibits us from being able to put cabinets on the west wall because it is currently only 1' from the corner. The size of the window would not change.

Substantially similar windows are allowed, Marvin windows are the current plan of the owners, per telephone call.
