1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The purpose of this grant is to increase public awareness of the need for early identification of pregnancy and early prenatal care as part of the pregnancy testing outreach objective. It will provide free pregnancy testing services at adolescent school health program assigned schools, Milwaukee Health Department health center walk-in clinics and WIC sites.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

Objective 2 of the Health Department's strategic plan is to reduce the five-year average infant mortality rate. Among the many consequences of teen pregnancy are maternal and infant complications. Early childbirth increases the risk of poverty for teen mothers and their families. This funding specifically addresses these issues which directly relate to the above objective

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

Community-wide, this grant works to improve the health of Milwaukee's citizens. Milwaukee has one of the nation's highest rates of teen pregnancy. This funding will allow the Milwaukee Health Department to work within the community to reduce these numbers and lower the health risks of infants born to teens. There is emphasis on the development of closer working relationships with the Milwaukee Public Schools and community agencies that service the teen population.

4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs):

Patient service records will be started on client with positive pregnancy test results in order to track the mother through pregnancy and provide counseling and referrals for early prenatal care and prenatal care coordination. High-risk cases will be referred to public health nurses for case management.
