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File # 020410 is a resolution relative to the application for the HUD Lead Abatement Extension Grant.

Background

- 1. This resolution authorizes the Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) to apply for the HUD Lead Abatement Extension Grant Project from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.
- 2. This resolution is for *application only*. MHD will submit another resolution for acceptance and expenditure if awarded this grant funding.
- 3. This application is for extension of the current HUD grant and may be considered a grant continuation.

Discussion

- 1. This project will fund lead hazard reduction in 800 low-income housing units in the health department's lead hazard reduction target area.
- 2. This grant will continue to fund the MHD primary prevention initiative, focusing upon lead hazard remediation in high-risk homes before a child is poisoned.
- 3. Using the last round of HUD money (\$1.3 million in 2000-2001), the MHD Home Environmental Health Division was able to fund lead hazard primary prevention in 816 low-income rental and owner occupied housing units. The average cost of remediation per unit was \$1650. These units are located in the MHD lead hazard reduction target areas in, primarily, Milwaukee's central city neighborhoods.
- 4. Reducing the number of children less than age 6 with lead exposure and increasing the percentage of housing units in the target area are outcome indicators for the MHD Environmental Health Division.
- 5. The anticipated grant period is January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2005.

Fiscal Impact

1. MHD is applying for \$2,000,000 from HUD.

2. There is no fiscal impact at this time. A budget for this project will be developed in the event, and at the time, that MHD receives grant dollars for this project.

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
