- 7. On 04/18/13 at 1:43 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1218 W Cherry for an Armed Robbery complaint. Investigation revealed two males robbed an employee and another patron while they were standing outside in front of Lorenzo's bar. Both suspects were armed with guns and obtained property before fleeing the area. Police spoke with the bartender Jimmie Harris, who stated he was inside and didn't observe the incident. Lorenzo's does not have video surveillance inside or outside the bar.

- 9. The applicant owes \$225.00 to the city of Milwaukee for Parking Citations with a violation date of 08/02/2004 and a due date of 01/17/2014 under case #04082484.
- 10. On 12/14/2013 Milwaukee police responded to a Battery complaint at 9403 West Silver Spring Drive #8. The caller stated he had been at Lorenzo's tavern (1218 West Cherry Street) earlier in the morning and another patron had punched him in the face. The caller received stitches at Mt. Sinai Hospital. Milwaukee police incident report # 133480101 filed.
- 11. On 01/18/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a Fight at 1206 West Cherry Street. Investigation revealed that a shooting had taken place in front of the tavern located at 1218 West Cherry Street (Lorenzo's). Witnesses told police that an unknown person began shooting at everyone in front of the business with an AK-47. The windows of a vehicle parked outside of the business were damaged as well as the victim being struck multiple times by gunfire. Milwaukee police incident report # 140180008 filed.
- 12. On 02/22/2014 Milwaukee police conducted a Traffic Stop of a vehicle that was leaving the area of the bar. The driver of the vehicle told officers he and his friends had just left the tavern and observed a fight occurring outside the business. The driver told officers that one or two of the subjects involved in the fight possessed firearms. The officers involved in the traffic stop then went to the business and were told by the applicant that everything was fine.
- 13. On 02/23/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a Battery Cutting at St. Joseph's Hospital. The victim told police she had been at Lorenzo's (1218 West Cherry Street) around 12:00am when a fight broke out inside the business. The victim decided to leave the business in order to avoid the fight. The victim later noticed she had a small cut on the right side of her abdomen, but does not where or when she received the injury. Milwaukee police incident report # 140540024 filed.

14. On Monday 04/28/2014 Milwaukee police conducted an investigation at 1218 West Cherry Street (Lorenzo's) based on information that the business was open in violation of the plan of operation, which indicated that the business should be closed on Monday. Officers found the business to be open, with several patrons eating and drinking on the premise as well as a lit "Open" sign on the west side of the business. The Class B License displayed at the business includes hours of operation Sunday, Tuesday through Thursday, Friday and Saturday but does not include hours of operation for Mondays. The applicant received two citations and a warning for a Food Dealers violation.

15. On 07/26/15 at 2:17 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 12th and Cherry for a male shot inside a vehicle. The auto was located at 1218 W Cherry Street. At 2:24 am, a squad was flagged down by security from Mt. Sinai Hospital regarding a gunshot victim that was just brought into the emergency room. It was determined to be the same individual reported to have been shot in the vehicle at 1218 W Cherry Street. Investigation revealed that both the suspect and victim were in the bar prior to the shooting. An argument between the two subjects occurred outside of the bar and the licensee reported hearing the argument and exited the bar in an attempt to resolve the issue. When the licensee thought the issue was resolved, he returned inside the bar. Gunfire then began outside the premise resulting in the victim being shot and later dying from his wounds. Multiply casings from several different guns were recovered from the scene.

16. On 10/17/15 at 1:47 am, Milwaukee police began monitoring the premise located at 1218 W Cherry. Police witnessed 3 male patrons entering the premise at 2:05 am and 2 female patrons shortly after in which the premise has a 2 am closing time. Police entered the premise at 2:17 am and found the bar had their lights on, music was being played and a DJ was operating music equipment. Police also found one subject behind the bar and the licensee was on scene and police counted 14 patrons inside the bar. One patron was observed to have an open ½ pint bottle of Remy Martin Cognac and a plastic glass in his hand. On top of the bar were 5 plastic glasses with a green liquid and a bottle of Bud Light. There were patrons seated at the bar and also at tables. Officer spoke with the agent and asked if he was aware of the 2 am closing time for his premise and he acknowledge he knew the closing time.


