Thank you for the price and delivery information on KD Oak lumber from you mill in Milwaukee.

As we discussed, our customer base is made up of dealers and cabinet shops that depend on us for continuous and consistent supply of quality products. Because it is critical that supply and quality remain constant over the long term it is necessary when selecting vendors that they can assure us that have the capability to meet our needs. Our best estimate on quantity requirements appears to be 25,000 B.F. monthly during the upcoming months. While long term growth is difficult to measure, in the short term we need your assurance of both the supply and quality availability before a program can begin. If our requirements cannot be met through Milwaukee Lumber we must seek another vendor with those capabilities.

Thank you again for the information provided, I am hopeful you are able to work through the production issues currently limiting supply. As always, we prefer to work with local vendors and remain confident this could be a good program for both parties if it can be implemented.
