1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

In 2016, there was a total of 16,660 crashes in Milwaukee with a total of 59 fatalities. Of these accidents, 405 were alcohol-involved crashes, resulting in 6 fatalities, and 80 drug-involved crashes, resulting in 16 fatalities. In 2017, there was a total of 16526 crashes resulting in 70 fatalities. Of these accidents, 503 were alcohol-involved crashes, resulting in 8 deaths, and 161 were drug-involved, resulting in 5 deaths. As of December 5, 2018, there was a total of 15478 crashes in Milwaukee, resulting in 48 deaths. There were 480 alcohol-involved crashes, resulting in 8 deaths, there were 139 drug-involved, resulting in 3 deaths.

Alcohol- and drug-impaired driving is associated with other high-risk behaviors that increase the likelihood of a crash and significance of injury or fatality; these include speeding and failure to wear seat belts.

Grantees therefore agree to the following responsibilities: 1) to work collaboratively to carry out the intent and objectives of the Grant’s operational plan on a continual basis; 2) to maintain a zero-tolerance approach for operating while under the influence of alcohol or drugs violations and occupant restraint violations.

Therefore, this Grant Project aims to develop a multi-jurisdictional Traffic Safety task force geared towards decreasing traffic crashes and obtaining voluntary compliance with traffic regulations. The Milwaukee Police Department agrees to the following responsibilities: 1) to serve as the fiscal agent for overall administration of the grant and project; 2) to organize deployment dates and activities in accordance with the operations plan; and 3) to reimburse Task Force agencies according to the MOU stipulations.
