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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. In the 4th
3	District, Sean Raffaelli, agent for "DLR, Inc.,"
4	Class "B" Tavern and Tavern Amusement
5	(Cabaret/Nite Club) renewal applications for
6	"Rickey's on State," 2601 West State Street.
7	Come up to the table, please.
8	THE APPLICANT: Good afternoon.
9	Please raise your right hands, we'll
10	swear you in.
11	(Whereupon the applicant and witnesses
12	were sworn.)
13	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Your name and
14	address for the record, please.
15	THE APPLICANT: Sean Raffaelli, 5615
16	Grandview Drive, Greendale, Wisconsin.
17	SERGEANT GRUBICH: Sergeant Wade
18	Grubich with the Milwaukee Police Department,
19	District 3.
20	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Let the record
21	show Alderman Bauman appears in this matter,
22	also. Would you state your appearance, please?
23	MR. LERNER: Robert Lerner, on behalf
24	of Mr. Raffaelli and Rickey's.
25	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Health department?

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1	HEALTH: No objection.
2	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Neighborhood
3	services?
4	DNS: No objection.
5	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Mr. Raffaelli, do
6	you admit to receiving notice in the mail there's
7	a possibility your application could be denied
8	because of items contained on the police report,
9	and neighborhood objections to loitering,
10	littering, loud music, noise, fights, shootings,
11	drugs, criminal activity, prostitution,
12	disorderly conduct, sales and presence of
13	underage, mismanagement of the location, and
14	conduct which has had an adverse impact on the
15	health, safety or convenience and the prosperity
16	of the neighborhood? Did you get one of those
17	notices?
18	THE APPLICANT: Yes, I did.
19	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Sergeant, first,
20	with the police report?
21	SERGEANT ULICKEY: As indicated,
22	incident number five was previously reported.
23	Dispositions that were added are as follows. In
24	regards to the posting of occupancy, he was found
25	guilty and fined 3,000 dollars. The safe egress

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1	was dismissed. The license of permit required is
2	found guilty and fined 212 dollars. And charges
3	to be posted, he was fined 343 dollars.
4	I will also add, excuse me, that the
5	items are misnumbered. The items contained on
6	page four should actually be items eight, nine
7	and ten. In regards to item number nine, on
8	11/10 of '06 Milwaukee Police were dispatched to
9	Rickey's for a large fight. Investigation
10	revealed four subjects attempted to enter the
11	tavern with one being denied entry due to the
12	policy of no patrons under 25 allowed in. A loud
13	verbal argument started between the subjects and
14	security, with it escalating to a physical fight.
15	Officers observed property damage to the tavern.
16	Because of the fight, most of the patrons inside
17	the tavern left. Officers viewed video from the
18	security camera which showed security did, in
19	fact, spend ten to 15 minutes attempting to
20	diffuse the situation before the fight actually
21	started. One employee did suffer a possible
22	broken nose, chipped tooth and a swollen hand.
23	Another employee suffered a large laceration to
24	the forehead. The four subjects were arrested
25	and charged with disorderly conduct.

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1	On 3/25 of '07 at two a.m. Milwaukee
2	Police were dispatched to Rickey's for shots
3	fired complaint. Officers arrived and spoke to
4	the bar manager identified as Michael Segal, who
5	stated that there was no fight or any shooting at
6	the club prior to the officers' arrival. The
7	call came in from an anonymous caller and
8	officers made the call baseless. However, at
9	3:04 a.m. detectives were sent to St. Joseph's
10	Hospital for two shooting victims, one with a
11	gunshot wound to his hand and chest, and the
12	other was shot to the left side of his head.
13	Both victims stated they were shot while
14	attempting to leave Rickey's on State. Officer
15	Segal Or officers contacted Segal and had him
16	respond back to Rickey's in attempts to locate
17	and preserve a crime scene. Segal was questioned
18	by detectives and admitted to them that a large
19	fight erupted inside the tavern near the stage
20	with a chair being thrown. Segal then stated he
21	heard what he thought was a shot being fired.
22	Video was recovered from the tavern that showed a
23	fight breaking out and a subject with a gun
24	getting up from the ground and firing shots
25	toward the front door of the tavern. Because of

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1	Segal's initial false statements to the officers
2	who responded earlier for the shots fired
3	complaint, the opportunity to gather witnesses,
4	recover evidence, and preserve the crime scene
5	were compromised.
6	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Thank you. Do you
7	have any questions about the police report?
8	MR. LERNER: I don't have questions. I
9	have comments.
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Then we'll
11	Then we'll listen to your comments.
12	MR. LERNER: As to the incident of
13	November 10th, it doesn't appear that anybody at
14	Rickey's did anything inappropriate. In fact,
15	they acted acted in a very appropriate way.
16	They They have a new policy that when we were
17	here last year, there were various suggestion
18	suggestions made by members of this committee to
19	the – – to – – to Don Raffaelli about changes,
20	and one that was not made but that he decided to
21	do himself was to to up the age for which
22	people could come in. You have to be You now
23	have to be at least 25 years old to come into the
24	tavern, and and this incident, somebody tried
25	to get in who who was who was didn't

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1	meet those requirements and started a scuffle.
2	And as the report indicates, the the security
3	people did try and diffuse the situation and
4	and and they they were certainly acting
5	appropriately.
6	As to the incident of of March 25,
7	2007 we I have appeared at meeting at a
8	meeting with the District Attorneys with the
9	District Attorney and and officers at the 3rd
10	District, who are conducting an exam
11	investigation in this matter. No charges have
12	been brought against Mr. Segal or anyone else.
13	Mr. Segal denies that that denies what
14	this report says he said to the officer. In
15	fact, he even said that the officer and told
16	the District Attorney, the officer who who
17	makes that statement really didn't even
18	wasn't the officer who was questioning him on the
19	night in question. We have been cooperating. We
20	met with the the District Attorney back in -
21	- in June, and they asked us to produce, and we
22	cooperated and made a full statement, and we
23	they asked us to produce some records that we
24	have we are in the process of getting
25	together, business records to either that we

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1	believe will corroborate the statements Mr. Segal
2	made to the police. The We expect to have
3	those records in the next ten days to two weeks,
4	I would say. Part of the problem that we've had
5	is that Mr. Raffaelli, who is the the owner
6	of the corporation, has been in in Italy for
7	the last three weeks and his plane landed at one
8	o'clock today in Chicago. He came right here to
9	participate in this meeting. He had taken his
10	daughter, who had graduated from college, along
11	with a friend of hers, and one of his sons, on a
12	trip to to Italy. And his where he
13	where his family lived before they came to the
14	United States. In the course of this matter when
15	the police came to the to the tavern, they
16	asked Mr. Segal, who was then the manager. He is
17	no longer the manager of Rickey's. That As
18	to the video system. He spent many hours working
19	with a detective who who was who said
20	they found they were able to identify
21	They got photographs and they or the pictures
22	he put together taking many hours, a videotape.
23	It's not It's not like a motion picture, the
24	way the system is set up, and they they
25	He's been They've been of help to the police

20	MR. LERNER: Well, we're not asking
21	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: I think that would be
22	appropriate, since they're putting the issue the
23	whether or not Mr. Segal is going to be
24	charged with obstructing. And since they're
25	stating to out of court hearsay statements, what

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1	it is Mr. Segal did and didn't see. We've not
2	had the benefit of his testimony. Certainly, I
3	think we should put it off, since they're making
4	that a major issue in this case. It's
5	represented to you that he has not been charged,
6	so that can't be considered. Well, then we
7	should wait until the District Attorney has made
8	a final decision on that matter, and put this
9	over until September.
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Just let me see a
11	show of hands. Are there any Is there anyone
12	here from the neighborhood to testify relative to
13	2601 West State Street? Are you here to testify
14	in opposition or support, sir?
15	THE WITNESS: Support.
16	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Support, okay.
17	Yeah, we We could hold this matter at the
18	call of the chair, effectively if this license
19	were renewed, you would have to close for two
20	days, though. But it's your request. You know,
21	you'd have to be closed from the You expire
22	on the 23rd of September. Is that correct?
23	MR. LERNER: Well, that's a question I
24	have. If I may make an inquiry of you.
25	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Yes.

00011 1 2	MR. LERNER: The notice that he
3	received said said that the license was up September 23rd. The license that was issued
4	after the There was a 30 day suspension last
5	year. The license that was issued and that's on
6	the wall at Rickey's says October 24th at at
7	the time started after the end of after the
8	30 day suspension. I don't know which is right.
9	MR. SCHRIMPF: That shouldn't have
10	happened, because you renew a license with the
11	suspension.
12	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: So it was probably
13	a typo, because that suspension
14	MR. SCHRIMPF: Well, I don't know.
15	What does Ms. Barron say?
16	MS. BARRON: The records that we have
17	say September 23rd, so I don't know And this
18	is where the license prints out from. So I don't
19	know how that would have happened?
20	MR. SCHRIMPF: Okay.
21	MR. LERNER: Okay.
22	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: So anyway, we can
23	We'll be glad to hold this matter over. But
24	just so you know, you'll have to close for two
25	days.

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1	THE APPLICANT: I have no problem with
2	that. I'd also like to make a statement.
3	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: It's a Sunday and
4	a Monday, so.
5	THE APPLICANT: That's fine.
6	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Go ahead.
7	THE APPLICANT: The statement I was
8	going to make was that last year Alderman Bohl
9	had a number of suggestions. And we took all of
10	his suggestions, every single one of them, and we
11	added to his suggestions, such as closing on all
12	holidays, which we never did. And in our
13	business, holidays are a very big business.
14	Christmas Day evening is very big. Thanksgiving
15	Day evening is very big. New Year's Day evening
16	is very big. And we We took that upon
17	ourselves to close those days. And then we put
18	together a list for the committee, which we'll
19	present to you, of all the changes we made. We
20	made the changes with Officer Kupsic and Officer
21	King. It went to Met with them and sat down
22	at the 3rd District Station, made the changes,
23	and they approved them all. They also had
24	They also said to me, now be careful, because if
25	you're going to go to 25 years of age, what could

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1	happen is your business could go down
2	considerably. And he said you got to You've
3	got to just fight the urge to go down back to the
4	21 to get to get the business up. And you
5	can see by what happened that we didn't go back.
6	We stuck to 25. So we'll have all this stuff
7	prepared for you at the time, also, along with -
8	- also, along with some witnesses who were there
9	the evening that Mr. Segal is accused of not
10	telling the truth, based on witnesses who were
11	there that evening, who were on the premise, who
12	were working, and can corroborate his story.
13	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Witkowski
14	moves to hold this matter at the call of the
15	chair?
16	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: Mr. Chair, real
17	briefly.
18	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Yes, Alderman
19	Bauman
20	ALDERMAN BAUMAN: I just want to alert
21	the committee I fully intend to ask for
22	nonrenewal of this license like I did the last
23	time after an extensive police record. The
24	committee saw fit to give 30 days, and I
25	certainly respected that decision. Now we're

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1	back to reopen in late October. Within two weeks
2	there's a big fight. Within three months of that
3	there's a shootout within inside the
4	premises, inside the premises where two people
5	are, in fact, shot. And the police are basically
6	given the runaround, which we will hear when the
7	Sergeant to my left testifies as to precisely
8	what took place. So that basically the crime
9	scene couldn't be secured. And that's when
10	they've only been open since October. So this is
11	a establishment that has demonstrated time and
12	time again that they cannot conduct business in a
13	safe, reasonable manner consistent with the
14	health, safety and welfare of the public. So I
15	will again be requesting nonrenewal.
16	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Motion by Alderman
17	Witkowski is to hold this matter to the call of
18	the chair. Is Are there any objections to
19	that motion? Hearing none, so ordered. We'll
20	see you back here in September.
21	THE APPLICANT: We'll close We'll
22	close those dates.
23	MR. LERNER: Do you know what the date
24	will be?
25	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: What's the date

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1	for the license meeting?
2	MR. SCHRIMPF: Oh, yeah.
3	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: September 11th?
4	MR. SCHRIMPF: Nine-one-one.
5	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: 9/11. We don't
6	know We don't know what time.
7	MR. LERNER: I suspect there will be a
8	lot of people here, and so, I don't know.
9	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Two or three.
10	MR. SCHRIMPF: Maybe Maybe the
11	license division wants to take that into account
12	for the schedule that day.
13	ALDERMAN WADE: Yeah, she said
14	afternoon meeting.
15	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Yeah, it will be
16	in the afternoon.
17	MR. LERNER: Okay. Thank you.
18	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Thank you.
