Columbia St. Mary's Temporary Helipad

Dear Ms. Lewis:

As we discussed on May 17, Columbia St. Mary's is currently working on plans for a replacement hospital for our existing facilities, located at our Lake Drive campus. The project includes construction of new facilities which are anticipated to be completed in 2009. Our facility currently operates a helipad, located on the west side of Lake Drive, about 600 feet north of North Avenue. The helipad is used approximately 4 times per month. The hospital reconstruction includes the relocation of the helipad to another permanent location on our property, however the existing helipad must be temporarily relocated during construction.

Our architects and engineers have evaluated a number of sites near the hospital for a temporary helipad in conjunction with the FAA and the regional Flight for Life Program. We have concluded that a location along Lincoln Memorial Drive, north of the Northpoint Pumping Station, is the most suitable site. The area provides a clear flight path from Lake Michigan to the east, and is also within a reasonable distance for our staff to transport patients by ambulance to our facility. The temporary helipad will be located at 2275 North Lincoln Memorial Drive, which is owned by the City of Milwaukee Water Works. Attached is a site plan that shows the proposed location of the temporary helipad. Please note that the site is well outside the perimeter fence for the pumping station, and will also be fenced.

We request that you review the proposed plan, and initiate preparation of a lease to allow Columbia St. Mary's to build, operate, maintain, and remove the temporary helipad. We would like to complete the lease process as quickly as possible, so that construction of the helipad can take place this summer. We can prepare a legal description of the lease area. We have already initiated the Board of Zoning Appeals process with the Department of City Development, to obtain a variance for construction of the helipad on the site.


