### Program Goals

Aligns with city-wide strategy to reduce crime and enhance quality of life. The funds for this grant are to be used to fund overtime for 2 officers assigned to DEA Task Force investigations. Monies for funded task forces are provided by DEA headquarters and includes additional resources for state and local overtime. Local task forces are deputized and tasked with performing the same duties as DEA special agents. The task force's primary purpose is to interrupt illegal drug trafficking through intelligence gathering and undercover operations. The efforts made from this task force will assist and lead to successful prosecutions at State and Federal levels.

### Programmatic Summary

The need for coordination of State and local governments along with Federal partners is crucial to combat drug trafficking due to the large scale of networks that extend past State and international borders. Effectiveness of the task force will be measured in the ability to dismantle Priority Targeted Organizations identified by the DEA, which aligns with local and nationwide missions.

### Data Summary:

The data within the table below counts all arrests by Milwaukee police officers by drug type for January 1 – December 31, 2014-2016. It should be noted that totals may not sum since an individual may be arrested for more than one charge and/or charge type. Furthermore, heroin arrests are inclusive of possession with intent to deliver and manufacturing and delivery, since possession of heroin falls under the scope of a Schedule I narcotic and cannot be determined.

Total drug arrests by the Milwaukee Police Department declined 19% from 2015-2016. The decline in marijuana arrests (-22%) contributed significantly to the decline in total drug arrests. The MPD increased arrests for cocaine (11% increase) and heroin (10% increase).
