Re: Common Council File #200294

Dear Committee Members,

On May 26, 2020 the Mayor issued a proclamation which granted Hazard Pay to general city employees in the amount of \$3.13 an hour. The proclamation was then approved by the Common Council (file #200147) on May 27, 2020. If the Common Council and the City want to extend this benefit to certain sworn police and fire employees, the City must enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) with those employees’ respective labor unions. The Milwaukee Police Association approached the City requesting to enter into a MOU with the City for hazard pay.

The City proposed the attached MOU to the Union, the terms of which are as follows:

- A \$250 lump sum, non-base building, non-pensionable bi-weekly payment.
- Payment ceases if any of the following occur: 1) funding becomes unavailable through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act”) Grant, the receipt of which was approved via Common Council File No. 200022; 2) Hazard Pay for the employees described above ceases to be an eligible expense under the CARES Act grant; or 3) the Health Commissioner declares an end to the Public Health Emergency.
- To be eligible an employee must be performing hazardous duty or work involving physical hardship, in each case that is related to COVID-19, and have duties which are substantially dedicated to mitigating or responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency, as defined in “Coronavirus Relief Fund Frequently Asked Questions” updated May 28, 2020.

A copy of the resolution, the MOU, and a fiscal impact statement are attached. It is recommended that the attached resolution be approved.
