


% Change in Proposed Budget






Net increase in 2023 projected salary costs after adjustments over actual 2021 spending.











Syphilis Epidemic.

Syphilis cases increased 137% in 2021 from 2020 to 78 cases per 100,000. Heavy infection cases among the non-Hispanic Black community, the department notes, demonstrate a significant racial inequity in sexual and reproductive health outcomes.

414LIFE Evaluation.

The Medical College of Wisconsin's Division of Surveillance and Informatics has developed a plan to evaluate the 414LIFE Program. There will be separate evaluations of the community- and hospital-based segments of the program. The community-based segment principally addresses the activities of violence interrupters and outreach workers. The hospital-based segment focuses on the activities of hospital responders.

414LIFE Program.

The 414LIFE program is the only direct service administered by the Office of Violence Prevention. The program focuses exclusively on gun violence in targeted neighborhoods. Implemented by the non-profit Uniting Garden Homes until 2021, 414LIFE is now housed in the Medical College of Wisconsin. Program teams include violence interrupters, outreach workers and hospital responders.

ReCAST Grant - 2016-2021.

The Office of Violence Prevention reports the \$5,000,000 federal ReCAST grant for 2016-2021 funded:

- The training of 500 City employees in trauma informed care.
- Programing in trauma informed care and social-emotional learning for 5,000 city youth.
- \$2.6 million is programing conducted by community based organizations.

ReCAST Grant Description.

The federal Resiliency in Communities After Stress and Trauma (ReCAST) grant is to assist high-risk youth and families, and to promote resilience and equity in communities that have recently faced civil unrest. Its goal is for local community entities to work together in ways that improve behavioral health, empower community residents, reduce trauma and sustain community change.
