Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. 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5. On 05/20/23 at 1:03am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1319 W. North Ave, for a shot spotter assignment (business also called the police). Officers were alerted to guns shots in the vicinity of the business, and located spent casings on the parking lot. Officers were notified that the local hospital had a victim related to the shots fired who stated she was in the gas station parking lot when the incident occurred. The business was cooperative with the investigation and provided surveillance footage that showed the incident.
6. On 05/24/23 at 5:11am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1319 W. North Ave, for a trouble with subject. Officers spoke with the employee who stated that a subject was on the property and damaged his vehicle. Officer attempted to view video but the employee did not have access to the surveillance system.
7. On 06/05/23 at 11:11am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1319 W. North Ave, for a shooting complaint after being notified by hospital staff that two shooting victims arrived. Officers spoke with the employee who was cooperative with the investigation. The employee provided video of the incident, a receipt of purchase from the suspected shooter, and a witness statement. The employee stated that he observed the suspect park near the gas pumps. Then a red vehicle pulled in to the parking lot. The suspect got into an altercation with the driver of the red vehicle. The victim reentered the red vehicle and the suspect started shooting at the occupants of the red vehicle. The red vehicle fled the area and the suspect then eventually fled in the suspect vehicle.
8. On 07/03/23 at 11:54am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1319 W. North Ave, for an overdose complaint. Officers arrived and on scene spoke with Milwaukee Fire, that were on scene for medical response. MFD personnel stated that they located a subject and administered Narcan, and that subject became responsive then left the area. MFD also treated two other subjects for possible drug overdose issues. Both subjects were transported to the hospital by ambulance, and admitted to officers of using drugs behind the location. Officers spoke with the employee and advised the business it has a loitering drug issue and must be aware when subjects are loitering. The employee stated that he does call for police services, regarding loitering complaints.

9. On 07/07/23 at 11:49pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1319 W. North Ave, for a welfare check of a female. Officers arrived and observed a group of subjects that appeared to be loitering. The female appeared to be on the ground but able to communicate. The subjects were smoking and had drinks in their hands playing loud music from vehicles. The subjects were told by officers that there is no loitering and had to leave. Some of the subjects left the location, but one subject stayed, he stated he worked for the location as security. Officers knew the subject to be an individual who has received drugs complaints. Officers spoke to the employee who was unaware of the loitering or the call of police service. The employee stated that the subject who claimed to be security does not work for the location. The employee was unable to provide video, regarding the incident because the employee stated that he did not have access to the video surveillance.
10. On 12/30/23 at 12:49am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1319 W. North Ave, for a damage to property complaint. Officer spoke with the employee who stated that a subject threw items on the floor, and damaged the card reader machine on the counter. The suspect became irate when he was asked to provide identification for proof of age for a tobacco product, he attempted to purchase. The suspect then left the store and got on a MCTS bus leaving the area.

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11. On 05/08/24 at 4:38a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Shooting that may have occurred at 1319 W. North Ave. The business was cooperative allowing officers to view video surveillance, however, it was determined the shooting did not occur at the business.
12. On 05/26/24 at 2:10a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Robbery at 1319 W. North Ave. Officers were advised by the caller they were parked in the lot, when they were approached by suspects with firearms who stated something incoherent. The caller and passenger were pulled out of the vehicle and fled on foot. The business was cooperative and allowed officers to view video surveillance which depicts a struggle between the suspect and two other subjects inside the gas station, in which the subjects point a firearm at the suspect. The suspect fled the scene, however, returned a short time later in a vehicle and approached the victim's parked car, pointing a firearm and eventually fleeing in the victim's vehicle.
13. On 06/29/24 at 2:16a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Subject with Weapon at 1319 W. North Ave. Investigation revealed the call was baseless as the subject described was armed security hired by the Agent.
14. On 07/08/24 at 12:35a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Shooting at a local hospital. The victim stated the incident occurred at 1319 W. North Ave. The officer conducted follow up and the business was cooperative providing video surveillance of the incident.
15. On 07/18/24 at 3:54a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Shooting at 1319 W. North Ave. Investigation revealed the victims were in a vehicle with other subjects a shot was fired from inside the vehicle. The driver exited the vehicle and passed firearms to a subject seated in another vehicle, then drove the victims to a hospital for treatment. The employee stated they were unaware a shooting occurred and the only call came from the hospital where the victims were treated for non-life-threatening injuries. The business did allow officers to view video surveillance of the incident.
16. On 07/29/24 at 11:20p.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Shooting at 1319 W. North Ave. On arrival officers located the victim who eventually succumbed to their injuries. The business was cooperative and allowed officers to view video surveillance of the incident. Video depicts the suspect fire multiple shots toward the victim in the lot of the business. The victim runs

away and the suspect is seen entering a vehicle and fleeing the scene. The caller was a citizen who heard the shots and observed the victim fall to the ground. A total of 9 casings were recovered.

17. On 07/30/24 a Nuisance Letter was drafted by the Captain of the District for 1319 W. North Ave. This was due to a Shooting that occurred on 05/08/24 in which the victim was approached by suspects who in the course of a Robbery, took the victim's gun and shot them in the forearm. This was also due to a Shooting that occurred on 07/08/24 in which the victim, after being at the gas station for some time, was driving away and a suspect produces a firearm and fires several rounds at the victim, shooting them multiple times in the back.
18. On 08/17/24 at 8:52p.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to an Abduction at 1319 W. North Ave. Officers were advised by the caller they observed a suspect open the rear compartment of an SUV and punch a female, who tried to flee. The suspect shut the door and left the scene with the female. The officer observed no security officers on scene and interviewed the employee who stated they didn't see anything but allowed officers to view video surveillance. Investigation revealed the subjects are cohabitants and the suspect was later arrested.
19. On 08/28/24 the District CPU Team and Captain received notice from the agent's attorney, the agent had to make an unexpected trip out of the Country and would not be available to meet until October.
20. On 08/29/24 at 1:05a.m., Milwaukee Police conducted a License Premise Check at 1319 W. North Ave. Officers found one security to be at the premise who stated they call police when they observe illegal activity occurring. The employee was advised to post the password to the camera system so officers can access it quickly during investigations. The employee was agreeable to this suggestion.
21. On 09/02/24 at 12:56a.m., Milwaukee Police conducted a License Premise Check at 1319 W./ North Ave. Two security guards were observed at the business. No violations were found.
22. On 09/12/24 at 10:35pm., (verified with officers and CAD the date and time listed in narrative is incorrect) Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Drug Dealing at 1319 W. North Ave. Officers interviewed two security guards who provided officers with photos of the vehicles involved in hand to hand transactions and provided a description of one of the subjects. The business was cooperative.
23. On 10/24/24 at 10:00a.m., Milwaukee Police held a meeting with the Agent and their Attorney. The agent and their attorney were provided with a Notice of Nuisance Premise Letter. The Attorney advised the officers they will be drafting an abatement plan.

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The listed items are Milwaukee Police Department calls for service to the license business at 1319 W. North Ave.

24. On 11/05/24, at 11:30 p.m. Milwaukee Police received a call for Drug Dealing. The caller stated there were about 3 to 4 subjects near the pumps for around two hours dealing drugs. The caller wished to remain anonymous. Upon officers' arrival they did not find anyone or vehicles matching the caller's description.

25. On 11/14/24, at 1:28 p.m. Milwaukee Police received a call for a Battery. An unknown male took several bags of chips without paying, and on his way out of the business he struck a female in the neck, causing her pain. No business violations observed.
26. On 11/20/24, the district captain accepted an 80/10 Nuisance Abatement plan for the business. The property will be monitored for nuisance activity.
27. On 11/21/24, at 9:21 p.m. Milwaukee Police received a Subject with Weapon complaint. The caller stated there are several armed subjects in vehicles near the pumps dealing drugs. Upon officers' arrival the subjects were not on scene and could not be located. No business violations observed.
28. On 11/26/24, at 1:25 a.m. Milwaukee Police received a Drug Dealing complaint. A manager called regarding subjects in two vehicles dealing drugs. Upon officer's arrival the subjects were gone and police service was not needed.
29. On 12/10/24, at 2:00 a.m. Milwaukee Police conducted a Business Check. Employees were cooperative and no violations observed.
30. On 12/14/24, at 2:08 a.m. Milwaukee Police conducted a Business Check. Employees were cooperative and no violations observed.
31. On 12/19/24, at 9:05 a.m. Milwaukee Police conducted a Business Check/. Employees were cooperative and no violations observed.
32. On 01/17/25, at 11:47 p.m. Milwaukee Police received a Trouble with Subject complaint. An unknown subject stood in middle of the entrance and refused to leave. The subject left prior to officers arriving.
33. On 01/18/25, at 1:13 a.m. Milwaukee Police received a Trouble with Subject complaint. Three unknown subjects stood on the property panhandling. The subject left prior to officers arriving.
34. On 01/22/25, at 5:00 p.m. Officers conducted follow-up. Two indivial were loitering outside of the business. The licenses were not posted in open view to the public. No other violations observed.
35. On 02/10/25, at 7:25 p.m., officer conducted Follow-up. Officers were able to review security camera footage from the business for evidence of a crime that occurred in the area. No business violations observed.
36. On 03/14/25, at 7:23 a.m. Milwaukee Police received a Drug Dealing complaint. A subject parked their vehicle on the lot and had around 5 to 6 people lining up to buy drugs from them. An employee and security guard asked the subject to leave but they refused. Upon officers' arrival the subject was not located.
37. On 04/04/25, at 11:55 p.m. Milwaukee Police received a Trouble with Subject complaint. The caller stated there were subjects standing outside of the business refusing to leave. Upon officers' arrival the subjects were not located.

38. On 04/05/25, at 12:04 a.m. Milwaukee Police received a Trouble with Subject complaint. The caller stated there were several subjects in the business refusing to leave. Officers did not locate the subjects and an employee at the business stated they did not have any issues at the establishment.
39. On 04/12/25, at 12:11 a.m. Milwaukee Police received a Trouble with Subject complaint. Subjects were at the location and refusing to leave.
40. On 04/12/25, at 2:59 a.m. Milwaukee Police received a Trouble with Subject complaint. The business's security guard called for police after a group of approximately 12 subjects were on the lot harassing customers and refusing to leave. Officers did not locate the subjects upon arrival.
41. On 04/15/25, at 1:34 a.m. Milwaukee Police received a Subject with Weapon complaint. Subjects known to each other engaged in a verbal argument in the parking lot. The argument escalated with one subject retrieving a firearm from their vehicle waving and pointing it. A security guard was on scene and called for police.
42. On 04/17/25, at 1:05 p.m. Milwaukee Police received a Theft complaint. The caller stated someone took their car keys, but did not file an official police report.
43. On 04/22/25, at 9:50 p.m. Milwaukee Police received a Theft complaint. The victim stated while on the property a friend assaulted them after a verbal argument due to not wanting to smoke crack cocaine. The victim requested an employee call for police service. No business violations observed.
44. On 05/10/25, at 6:04 p.m. Milwaukee Police received a call for a Battery. The caller stated two individuals were physically fighting in the parking lot. Upon officers' arrival they located one of the actors, who refused medical or to give information on the second known actor. An employee on scene stated the security cameras would not allow them to rewind and check footage. No police action taken.
45. On 05/13/25, at 12:26 a.m. Officers responded to a shooting near the property. Several subjects were on the property for hours drinking and smoking in the parking lot before one of the subjects shot and killed the victim at 2231 N Teutonia Av. The surveillance video captures the alleged suspect. In the video the suspect crosses path with security several times and a firearm is also observed.
46. On 05/13/25, at 7:37 p.m. Officers conducted a Business Check. Upon arrival several individuals were observed loitering on the property, which an employee stated was an ongoing problem. Security was not on scene and started their shift at 9:00 p.m. No violations were observed.
47. On 05/21/25, at 4:11 p.m. Officers conducted a Business Check. The business was open and serving customers. Officers confirmed with an employee the business had been open all day to the public. The employee was advised that the licenses were not renewed, and they should not be operating. An officer spoke to the agent via phone, and informed them that they were in violation by being open. The agent stated they spoke to the alderperson and were granted a provisional license to operate. The agent was advised no license was approved and the business

should close, also that citations will be issued for operating with expired licenses. (As of 05/26/25 no citations are Muni Court Search).

48. On 05/25/25 at 1:13p.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Trouble with Subject. The business called regarding a subject doing drugs in the rear of the location. The subject was gone on officer's arrival.

On Monday, June 16, 2025, at approximately 9:18PM (while in full duty uniform with an Axon body worn camera activated and in a marked MPD squad car) my partner P.O. Alexander LEITZKE and I assigned to Squad 3242 responded to 1319 W. North Avenue, which is located in the City and County of Milwaukee Wisconsin for a Trouble with Subject call for service.
