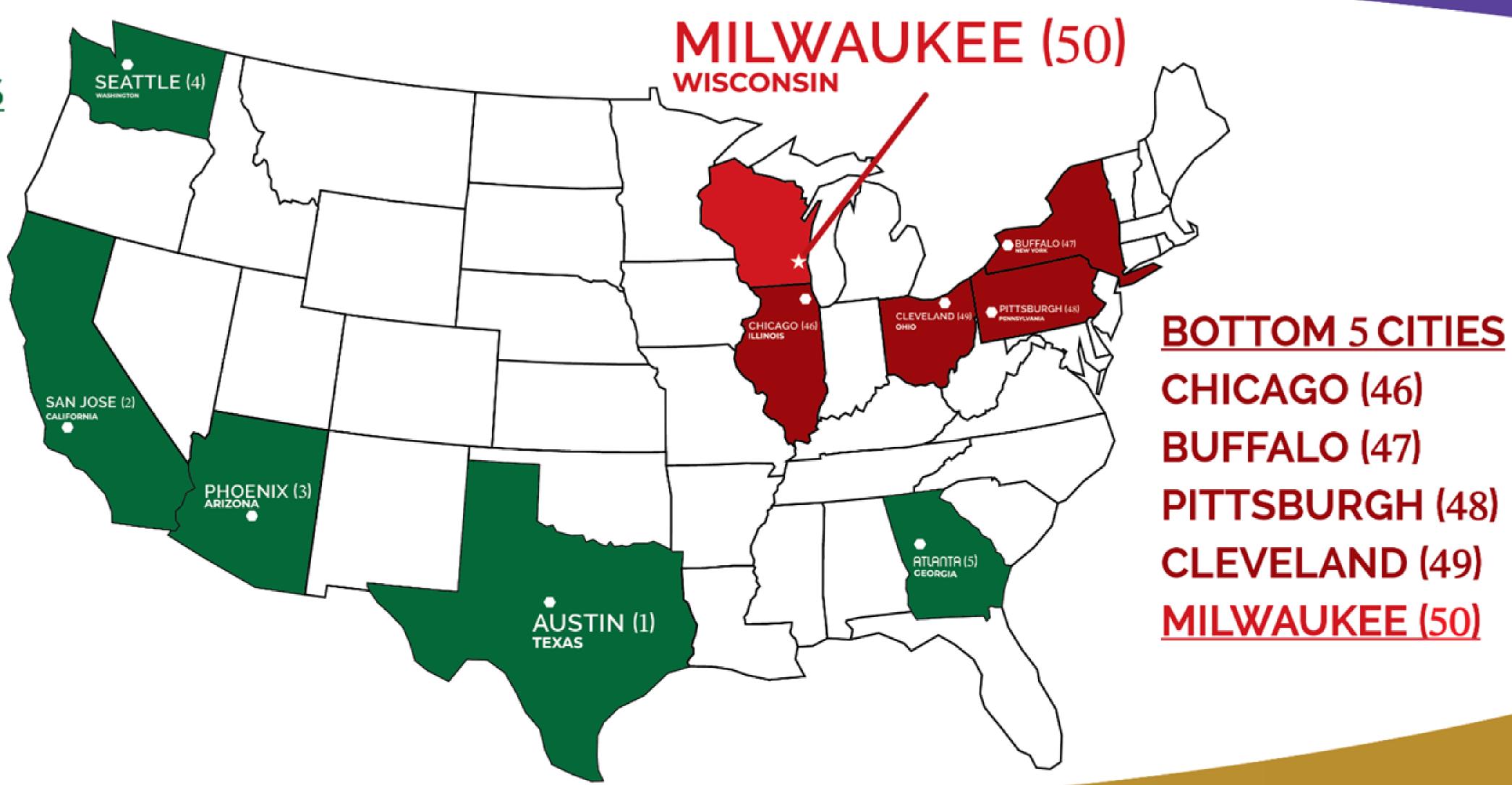

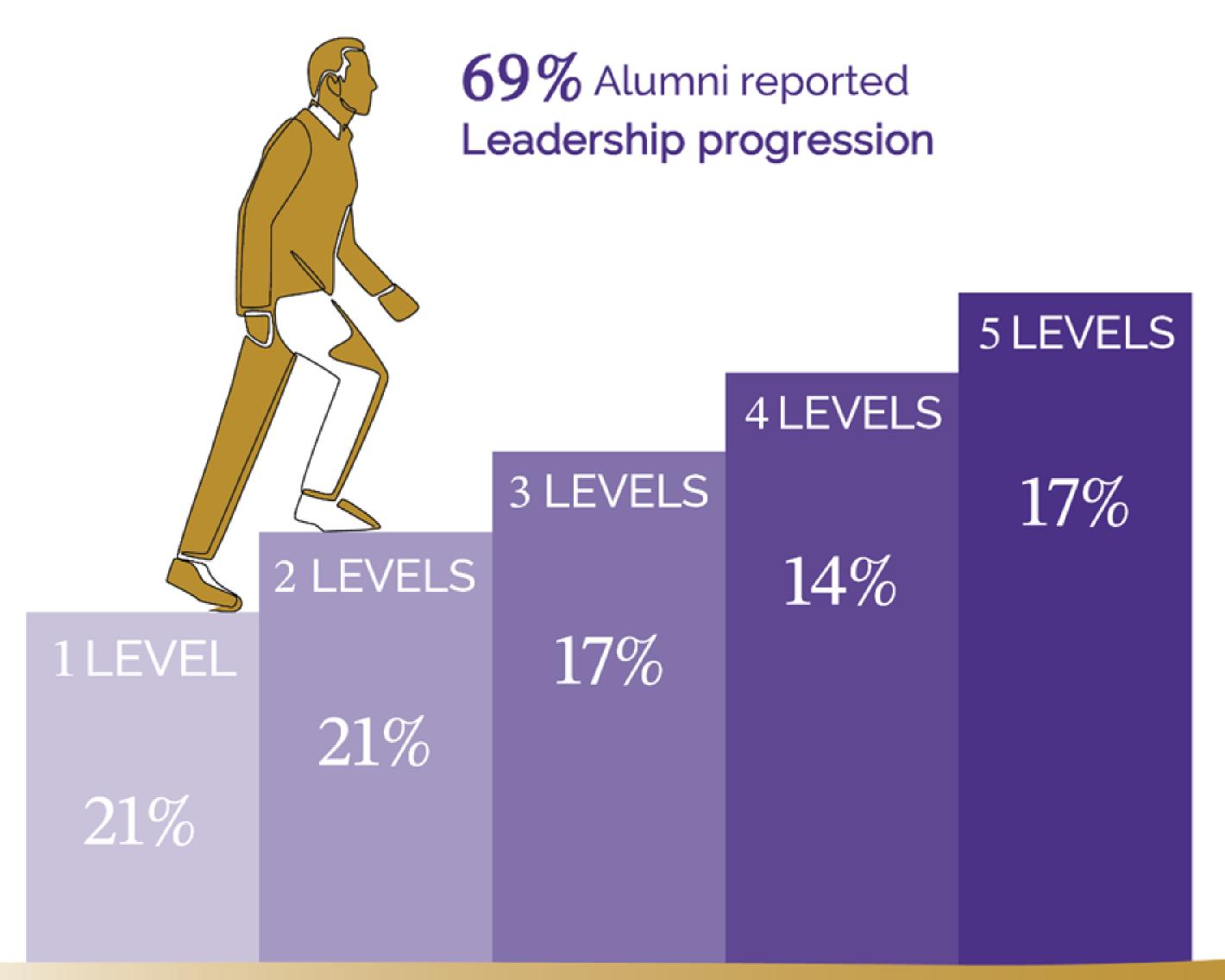

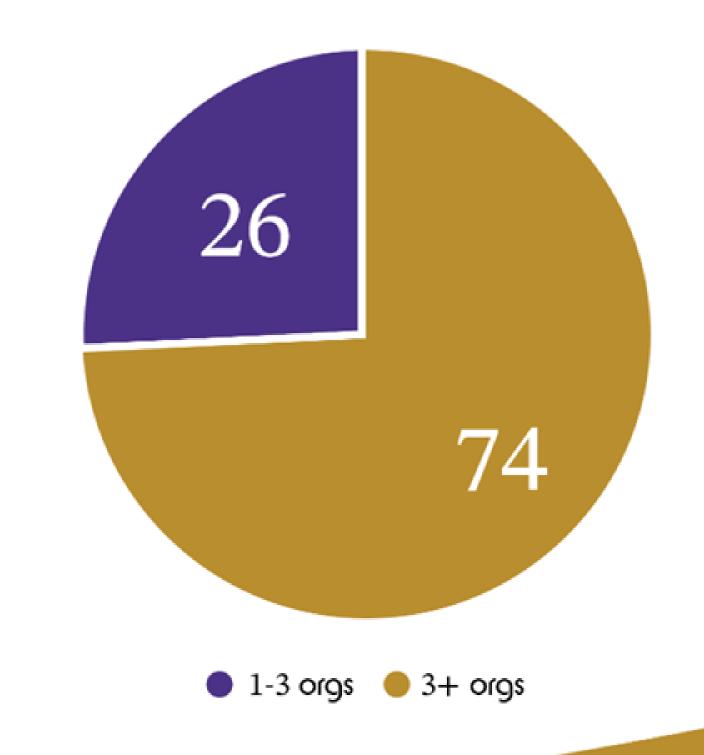


AFRICAN AMERICAN LEADERSHIP PROGRAM IMPACT

Over 50% of alumni have served on boards.





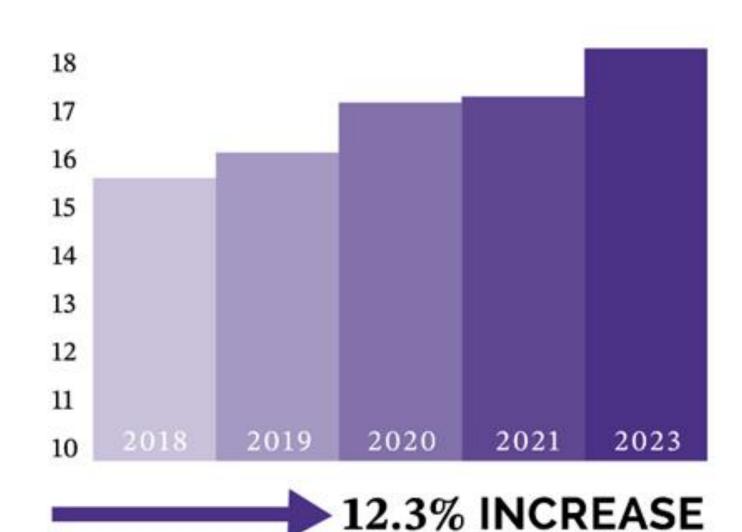
ENCOURAGEMENT FOR THE FUTURE

- MILWAUKEE'S NOTORIOUSLY HIGH SEGREGATION RATE DECLINED MODESTLY

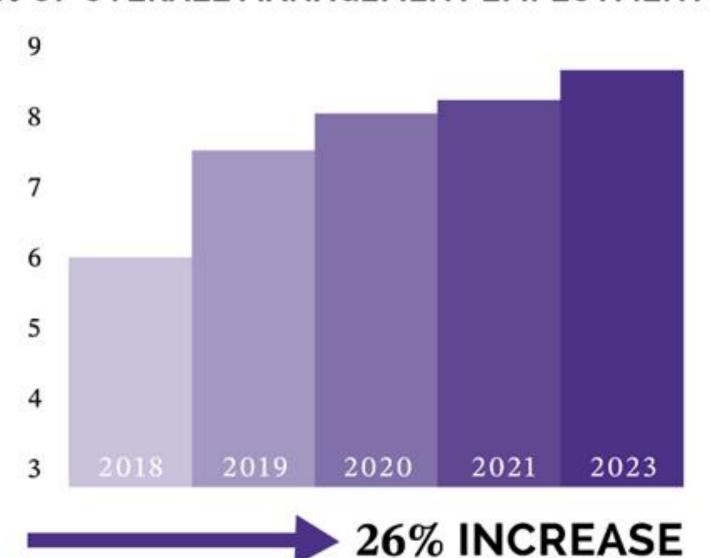
MMAC REGION OF CHOICE DATA
