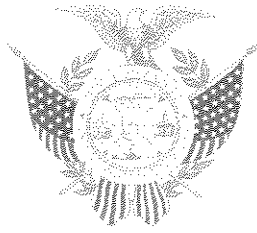

**RE: Opinder SINGH – Renewal of the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver’s License  
Written Objection to the Report of the Public Safety Committee**

Dear Milwaukee Common Council:

On October 4, 2012, I appeared with Opinder Singh at the Public Safety Committee hearing. At that time, I argued that Mr. Singh’s Public Passenger Vehicle Driver’s license should be renewed with a 30-day suspension based on his lack of any criminal or traffic record, apart from his criminal conviction for Disorderly Conduct and 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Sexual Assault on July 24, 2012. Yesterday, I received the Report of the Public Safety Committee, which recommends that the Common Council deny the renewal of Mr. Singh’s license based upon the police report, criminal complaint, and judgment of conviction.

This letter is an objection to the Report’s Conclusion of Law that Mr. Singh poses a public safety risk as a holder of a Taxicab Permit. In support of this objection, I request five minutes to make an oral argument at the next Milwaukee Common Council hearing on October 16, 2012.
