1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

This program will enhance our firefighting and rescue capabilities by allowing us to implement a pilot Safety Program, which will provide enhanced fireground safety, complete department vehicle accident investigation and training to drivers, assistance to citizens who frequently use emergency medical services, and workplace safety investigation and training. The Milwaukee Fire Department provides fire and EMS services to the citizens and visitors to the city the Milwaukee.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

Strategic Goal: Protect Milwaukee's citizens from crime, fire, and other hazards.
Strategy 7: Reduce the damage caused by fires and other catastrophes that do occur.

This grant is related to the above Public Safety Strategies and Actions as well as the department's objective to provide timely fire and emergency services to make the city a safe place to live, work, and conduct business. The \$234,020 available through this grant will enhance the Fire Department's provision of fire and emergency medical services; for the safety of fire fighters, citizens, and visitors to the City of Milwaukee.

This grant will provide funding for four civilian contracted positions, and essential equipment, vehicles, and office supplies for the pilot Safety Program.
