Monthly Employment Watch: Milwaukee and the Nation's Largest Cities

About This Report

Each month, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Center for Economic Development, drawing on data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, monitors employment trends in Milwaukee and the nation's 50 largest cities. In addition, the Center also compares employment trends in Milwaukee to a smaller and more directly comparable group of "peer" cities, the 20 largest cities of the Northeast-Midwest "Frostbelt" region. Each month, the data compiled by the Center display year-overyear total employment for three different time periods: a) the most recent year (2006-2007); b) the past three years (2004-2007), since the current mayoral administration took office; and c) since 2000, the peak of the last business cycle. By looking at three different time periods, and two different samples of cities, we hope to provide a fuller sense of how Milwaukee's employment growth stacks up against other big cities over time, and how Milwaukee's position has changed over time.

The Monthly Employment Watch: November

The most recent monthly employment data for cities (November) reveal that Milwaukee continues on the path of sluggish employment growth observed through most of 2007. Employment increased by only 394 in November 2007 compared to November 2006, a miniscule year-over-year increase of 0.16%. Combined with the employment decline reported in October, the signs are troubling that Milwaukee may have already slipped into the recession threatening the national economy. In November, Milwaukee ranked 41st among the nation's 50 largest cities in rate of employment growth over the past year (Table 1), and 12th among the nation's 20 largest "Frostbelt" cities (Table 4). The national ranking is unchanged from the October 2007 "Employment Watch," while the Frostbelt ranking represents an improvement from 13th in October.

Since 2004, November employment in Milwaukee has increased by 1,795 (0.72%), placing the city 46th among the nation's 50 largest cities (Table 2) and 13th among the 20 largest Frostbelt cities (Table 5) in the rate of employment growth during this time period. In October, Milwaukee's rate of 2004-2007 employment growth ranked 45th nationally and 14th in the Frostbelt. Clearly, since 2004 the pace of growth has been much less robust here than in most big cities, both in the nation as a whole as well as in the Frostbelt.

Moreover, as we have noted throughout the year, the tiny recent employment increases have not compensated for the massive employment loss experienced in Milwaukee since 2000. Since November 2000, Milwaukee's employment has declined by 18,103, or 6.7%. This decline places Milwaukee 47th among the nation's 50 largest cities in employment growth since 2000 (Table 3), and 19th among the 20 largest Frostbelt cities (Table 6). Those rankings represent a decline of one position from last month's employment watch.

Finally, comparison of November unemployment rates in the 50 largest cities reveals the degree to which Milwaukee remains one of the country's most distressed urban labor markets (Table 7). In November 2007, Milwaukee had the 47th highest unemployment rate among the nation's 50 largest cities, posting a preliminary rate of 7.3%. Only Detroit, Oakland, and Fresno ranked worse. Since 2000, Milwaukee's November ranking on unemployment among the 50 largest cities has steadily deteriorated, placing 34th in November 2000, 37th in November 2004, 45th in November 2006, and 47th in November 2007.
