Dear Mr. Langley:

We have reviewed your September 30, 2002 letter and attached claims submitted by Ameritech and offer the following.

West Howard Avenue was reconstructed in 2002 from South 27th Street to South 13th Street. As part of the reconstruction of West Howard Avenue, a private contractor removed all existing pavement, granular sub-grade and soil over a city owned bridge, a box culvert located at 2500 West Howard Avenue. The contractor, Zignego Company, Inc., exposed all utilities located by Diggers Hotline which were placed on or near our box culvert. City crews were then scheduled to conduct concrete repairs to the box culvert prior to the contractor completing the reconstruction of West Howard Avenue.

Bridge Maintenance crews performed concrete repairs and placed a waterproof membrane over the box culvert, our work was to be completed prior to final paving by contractor. City crews power washed the concrete deck of the box culvert, a City Bridge Inspector then sounded the surface of the box culvert. All delaminated concrete areas were marked for removal and repair. City laborers, working under direct supervision of a Bridge Carpenter, chipped out the delaminated concrete areas with hand chippers. They exposed a pipe while performing the concrete chipping. Since this pipe did not serve a structural purpose in the bridge, we contacted the City's underground services and asked them to determine if this was an undocumented City facility. This pipe could not be associated with any City facility. After searching our records we were unable to find any agreements between the City and any utility for 2500 West Howard Avenue that allowed a utility to place and maintain private conduit buried within the concrete deck of the box culvert.

We contacted Ameritech about the pipe. Ameritech locators that were sent to the site did not believe that the pipe was part of their facility. They first believed that their duct package was under the River and under the city owned box culvert. Ameritech field personnel eventually

determined that their duct package was actually within the bridge deck and not underneath the box culvert. They told one of our Bridge Carpenters that the pipe we exposed did not contain any wires. Ameritech personnel placed a sleeve over the pipe that our crews exposed. Ameritech field personnel also told our Bridge Maintenance Manager that they would request their engineers' permission to abandon the duct package within the bridge deck, then core through the culvert side walls and establish their standard hanging duct package under the bridge deck.

The following day Ameritech pulled a backhoe and breaker onto the bridge deck and began "looking" for additional Ameritech ductwork. Their operator exposed an area of missing reinforcement where a previous repair and concrete patch appeared to have been made. This previous duct repair could explain the failed area located by a City Bridge Inspector during his deck inspection. The Ameritech backhoe hit and damaged the initial conduit repair and another Ameritech conduit buried in the bridge deck. The Ameritech backhoe breaker, while probing for their undocumented conduits, also punched a hole through the top of the City's concrete box culvert – substantially increasing the scope of the deck repairs that the City had to complete prior to placement of the waterproof membrane. Ameritech's explorations of the box culvert, their self-inflicted cable damage and the added cable repair threatened to delay the reconstruction of West Howard Avenue.

City workers hand chipped additional concrete away from the conduit exposed by Ameritech forces prior to repairing the remaining delaminated areas on the deck and some of the areas damaged by Ameritech. At the request of Ameritech, Bridge Maintenance crews placed a 1/4" steel plate over areas of their exposed conduit. City forces then completed the concrete repairs and placed the waterproof membrane on the deck of the box culvert.

There were not any records of Ameritech having any conduits within our box culvert. Therefore, we did not have any knowledge of the empty Ameritech conduit that we exposed while conducting deck repairs. City forces worked with Ameritech to resolve their confusion regarding their facilities placed within our structure. We even placed a steel plate over one of the Ameritech conduits that they exposed.
