In particular, bids to conduct Storm Sewer Flooding and Sanitary Sewer Televising were higher than anticipated. Funds available in the Water Quality Projects program were intended to cover city costs for a bid retention facility in the Menomonee Valley. The scope of the project was reduced to complete the work within budget and the remaining funds are now available for reprogramming.
