

**AMENDMENT TO THE  
PRIVATE AMBULANCE SERVICE PROVIDER AGREEMENT  
FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES  
IN CERTAIN AREAS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE**

This is an Amendment to the contract ("Contract") by and between the City of Milwaukee, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Wisconsin, and Curtis-Universal, Inc. ("Provider").

Whereas, the City and Provider entered into the Contract on or around December 17, 2025 under the terms of City Ordinance Section 75-15; and

Whereas, prior to executing the Contract the City has provided a subsidy to Provider to account for financial shortfalls realized by the Provider when they are not compensated for the services they provide; and

Whereas, the agreement stipulates the Milwaukee Fire Department shall present a file to the Common Council seeking continuance and/or adjustment of the subsidy every year in which the Provider demonstrates that it would not be financially viable for Provider to continue providing services in its Service Area absent a subsidy; and

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter stated, the parties do hereby agree to amend the Contract as follows:

1. The terms of the Amendment shall continue from January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026, wherein the subsidy for each Accepted Call shall be \$104.30.
2. Provider shall allow the City to perform an audit of the following information to confirm that Provider is utilizing the subsidy funds to acquire staff and resources to respond to 911 events:
  - Shift times
  - Apparatus available to respond to a 911 incident
  - Accepted calls
  - A limited set of patient information and disposition, stripped of personally identifiable information and in a HIPAA compliant manner.
  - Vehicle status
  - Incident logs
3. The City agrees to work in good faith with the ambulance service providers, OEM Medical Direction, Wisconsin Department of Health Services and local health care partners to address components of the Milwaukee EMS system that add to call volume. These items may include, but are not limited to:
  - i. Low acuity calls
  - ii. High utilizers
  - iii. Response time expectations

iv. Alternative response options

These changes constitute the entire Amendment to the Contract. All other covenants, provisions, terms and conditions of the Contract shall remain in force unless further amended by mutual agreement of the parties. This Amendment may be signed in multiple parts, which together will constitute a whole. Electronic/pdf signatures are acceptable.
