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1	PROCEEDINGS					
2	(All City Personnel were previously duly					
3	sworn.)					
4	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Finally, we have Carolyn					
5	Koch, agent for McDonald's Corporation 24-hour					
6	establishment application for McDonald's at 3137 South					
7	76th Street in the 11th District. And thank you for					
8	your patience and your accommodating us here. Were					
9	you sworn in beforehand, Carolyn?					
10	MS. KOCH: I was not.					
11	(Whereupon, CAROLYN J. KOCH was duly sworn.)					
12	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Alderman Witkowski would					
13	move for reconsideration on this item. Hearing no					
14	objections, so ordered. And Ms. Koch, I need to ask					
15	you if you acknowledge receiving notice of today's					
16	meeting with the possibility that your application					
17	could be denied? It is cited for an objection that					
18	this location if licensed for a 24-hour establishment					
19	would lead to excessive noise, late night					
20	disturbances, litter, loitering, and traffic generated					
21	by the existence of a 24-hour license that the health,					
22	welfare, and safety of the neighborhood will be					
23	adversely impacted.					
24	Department of Neighborhood Services?					
25	MS. BENDER: Neighborhood Services has two					

00003 1 sets of orders on this property, one of those orders being in violation of their Board of Zoning Appeals plan of operation. In November we received a 4 complaint that this McDonald's was violating their 5 plan of operations on the weekend, operating until 6 1:00 a.m. on weekdays contrary to their plan. 7 An inspection was done, and the inspector 8 met with Carrie Koch, who acknowledged the extended 9 hours in the past. She said they have restricted 10 hours after speaking with the alderperson and that 11 they were no longer violating their plan of operation. 12 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Ms. Bender, what were the 13 approved hours of their operating until 1:00 a.m.? 14 MS. BENDER: You must operate your facility 15 in accordance with the plan of operation approved by 16 the Board of Zoning Appeals January 28, 2003, and 17 specifically, the hours of operation are Sunday, 5:00 18 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. and Friday, Saturday 5:00 a.m. to 19 12:00 a.m. During the summer hours, the restaurant 20 stays open one our later Memorial Day through Labor 21 Day. 22 MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. Chairman, could a copy of 23 that be made a part of the record?

CHAIRMAN BOHL: Do you have an additional copy that you can provide?

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00004 1 MS. BENDER: I can get an additional copy. 2 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Was there any other objection? 4 MS. BENDER: We had orders on the property. 5 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Are there questions by 6 committee of Ms. Bender here at this point relating to 7 this? And when we do have a copy of that, we'll have 8 Alderman Davis move to make those Neighborhood Service 9 orders part of our record. Hearing no objections, so 10 ordered. 11 There is no police report. We'll go to you, 12 Alderman Dudzik. ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Thank you. Because of a 13 14 number of reasons, I have intimate knowledge of this particular property. First of all, I live four blocks 15 16 away. Secondly, I had in the past received complaints 17 that the place was actually operating 24 hours. Those 18 complaints came into my office quicker than I could 19 get the place shut -- or get the place to comply with 20 its plan of operations. It took me weeks to get that

without notifying anybody.

I have another fast food franchise in the area that recently remodeled and in their remodeling

done as opposed to the complaints which occurred

probably within days of them operating 24 hours

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00005 plans asked for potentially longer hours, and I have 1 yet a third franchise that is now pushing for 24-hour service. And I have had a neighborhood meeting on the 4 topic of the expansion of one franchise and on the 5 other franchise request for a liquor license, and it 6 is very clear to me, without even living in the 7 neighborhood, that expanded hours for any of these 8 franchises along 76th Street is not something that the 9 neighborhood would like to see. And, again, I ask 10 that this be denied. 11 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Ms. Koch, is there anything 12 that you would want to say in terms of the plan of 13 operation? I'm going to guess at this point that you 14 are not necessarily seeking 24 hours? I don't want to 15 speak for you here. 16 MS. KOCH: That's correct, that's correct. 17 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Is this comparable to what 18 we've seen in some of the other corporate stores, 2:00 19 a.m.?20 MS. KOCH: Yes. 21 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Friday night to Saturday 22 morning? 23 MS. KOCH: Seven days a week. 2.4 CHAIRMAN BOHL: 2:00 a.m. seven days a week? 25 MS. KOCH: Yes.

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CHAIRMAN BOHL: So operation would be to change to allow additional hours of midnight to 2:00 a.m. And just so you're aware, even if that were approved, it sounds as though from the approval of the recent BOZA you have to have that amended. Even if this body were to approve it, you would have to have that amended to reflect the hours from 11:00 p.m. to midnight to get that additional hour, otherwise, functionally you're shut down for an hour, then I guess you could open back up at midnight for two more hours.

MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. Chairman. Like all licenses that the committee is familiar with in the alcohol beverage arena, there has to be zoning for alcohol beverages and there has to be a license. You need both things to operate. So if they have a license, that's fine, but they also need the Board of Zoning Appeals to do it. If they have BOZA, that's fine, but they also need a license. You need two things to operate. It's kind of like a train; you need a locomotive and tracks. No tracks, no train, no locomotive, no train. You need both things.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: Thank you, Mr. Schrimpf. ALDERMAN DAVIS: Now I'm really clear on

this one.

00007 1 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Is there anything that you 2 would like to provide at this point in terms of additional information? MR. PRZYBYSZEWSKI: I just have one 4 5 question. According to BOZA, it says that we can open 6 til 11:00 p.m. and midnight on Friday and Saturdays, 7 but then from Memorial Day to Labor Day we can stay 8 open one hour later. Is that still acceptable, or it 9 can only be midnight seven days a week, correct? 10 CHAIRMAN BOHL: If this committee does not 11 grant you that license between Memorial Day and Labor 12 Day, you're functionally back to midnight. 13 MR. PRZYBYSZEWSKI: So we can do midnight 14 seven days a week. That is acceptable, that's within 15 the guidelines of --16 CHAIRMAN BOHL: If it grants you an 17 additional hour during those summer months, it would 18 be midnight seven days a week then. 19 MR. PRZYBYSZEWSKI: Thank you. That's all I 20 have. 21 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Nothing additional then at 22 this point here? I'm going to guess the same 23 standard, the same plan of operation in terms of what 24 you would do to prevent is pretty concurrent with the

other locations. Questions by committee? Otherwise,

00008 1 this matter is in committee. Is there a motion? ALDERMAN WITKOWSKI: I'll move to deny based on the fact it would lead to excessive noise, late 4 night disturbance, would affect the health, safety, 5 and welfare of the adjoining neighborhood. 6 CHAIRMAN BOHL: The motion by Alderman 7 Witkowski is for denial based on excessive noise, late 8 night disturbances, and that the license would 9 adversely impact the health, safety, and welfare of 10 the neighborhood. On the motion, Alderman Davis. 11 ALDERMAN DAVIS: On the motion, I'd like to 12 ask Mr. Schrimpf, since on the inspection report from 13 BOZA and Department of Neighborhood Services indicate 14 a non-compliance and now that that's part of the 15 record, can we also use that as criteria for denying, 16 also? 17 MR. SCHRIMPF: Sure. That's clear in the 18 ordinance. 19 ALDERMAN DAVIS: If I may ask Alderman 20 Witkowski to amend his motion as a friendly amendment 21 to include the report that was just made part of the 22 record also for reason for denial. 23 ALDERMAN WITKOWSKI: So amended. 2.4 MR. PRZYBYSZEWSKI: Can I comment to that?

CHAIRMAN BOHL: No, you cannot. Once a

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measure is in committee, the only three people I want to hear from is either myself, Alderman Witkowski, or Alderman Davis, and that's it. The motion as amended would be based on the aforementioned objections as well as past non-compliance with BOZA. Mr. Copeland?

MR. COPELAND: I'm sorry, Mr. Chairman. I need a point of clarification. In their BOZA decision, is it says during the summer hours the restaurant stays open one hour later Memorial Day through Labor Day. The motion is to deny the 24 hours. Does it also deny this section?

CHAIRMAN BOHL: Functionally my read on this -- and I will stand corrected here -- my read is BOZA has the ability to grant you additional hours for a specific period of time. We deal with an annual license. BOZA can say, Jim, that you can stay open for two days a year and specify the two days. We deal with an annual license, and we don't have the ability to extend your hours for two days. So, therefore, functionally a denial would mean that nothing would be operating beyond 12:00 midnight year around.

It would kill BOZA, it would nullify the additional hour for the three months that BOZA provides them for. That is correct, that's what it boils down to.

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MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. Chairman, I think you're correct. The point is that if BOZA says they can be open one additional hour Memorial Day through labor day, then they have to come in here, and they have to apply for a license to operate. Now, Mr. Chairman, the license — and I agree with you — the license would be granted for a year, that's true, but the fact of the matter is is that because they need both the license and the BOZA approval, functionally the license would only be operating.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: They've just got the track without the locomotive. They're not going anywhere.

MR. SCHRIMPF: Actually, if the committee granted the license, they could go to the one extra

15 hour.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: They're going to be able to go down to the next station on the path.

 $$\operatorname{MR.}$  SCHRIMPF: They're going to take a small side, Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: I hope that's clarification here. So the motion as amended here would be based on the neighborhood objections relayed and in addition to past non-compliance with BOZA, BOZA-stipulated hours. Is there any discussion on that motion? Is there any objection? Hearing none, so ordered. Thank you.
