4	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Moving on to the 16th				
5	Aldermanic District. Catherine Carew, agent for				
6	McDonald's Corporation, 24-hour establishment				
7	application for McDonald's, 6409 West Blue Mound Road.				
8	MS. CAREW: Good afternoon.				
9	CHAIRMAN BOHL: I'm going to surmise that				
10	you are Ms. Carew.				
11	MS. CAREW: Yes.				
12	CHAIRMAN BOHL: We need to swear you in, and				
13	for Mr. Przybyszewski, you've already been sworn in				
14	earlier, and we'll have Alderman Murphy's aide,				
15	Jessica Sewell, so we'll swear you in, as well.				
16	(Whereupon, CATHERINE CAREW, JESSICA SEWELL				
17	were duly sworn.)				
18	CHAIRMAN BOHL: For Ms. Carew, do you				
19	acknowledge receiving notice of today's meeting with				
20	the possibility that your application could be denied?				
21	It is cited for neighborhood objection that the				
22	license the location of the license 24-hour				
23	establishment will lead to excessive noise, late night				
24	disturbances, litter, loitering, traffic generated by				
25	the existence of a 24-hour license such that the

1	health, safety, and welfare of the adjoining				
2	residential neighborhood will be adversely impacted.				
3	Thank you. Neighborhood Services?				
4	MS. BENDER: No objection.				
5	CHAIRMAN BOHL: There is no police report.				
6	MS. SEWELL: Alderman Murphy would like to				
7	object to it. The location is by a residential area				
8	and also a school, and he has concerns for loitering				
9	and possible cruising it may attract by extending the				
10	operating hours.				
11	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Question for you in regard				
12	to this, Ms. Carew. What are the present hours of				
13	this location?				
14	MS. CAREW: Currently we are open from 5:00				
15	a.m. to 11:00 p.m.				
16	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Is that seven days a week?				
17	MS. CAREW: Yes.				
18	CHAIRMAN BOHL: 5:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.				
19	Have you had any discussion with Alderman Murphy				
20	regarding the desire to expand these hours?				
21	MS. CAREW: Yes. Mr. Przybyszewski called				
22	for me. Basically, I'm not looking for 24 hours, I'm				
23	just looking for extended hours because of the impact				
24	of road construction. We're looking at four months of				
25	construction from mid May to mid September, which

could impact us possibly 50 percent. Because one side of the street is going to be open, I'll only have one accessibility point to the restaurant. I'm only looking to be open until 2:00 Friday and Saturday and until midnight Sunday through Thursday.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: The midnight Sunday through Thursday is nothing that we can consider because we are only dealing with the hours between midnight and 5:00 a.m., and that would be an issue that would have to go before the Board of Zoning Appeals. In terms of the two other days, I mean, that's an issue that I think it's important -- And you know you're dealing with five applications here, as well, too, and you've indicated in many of these circumstances you're not looking for 24 hours. I'm letting you know to go to an alderman and say I want 24 hours when you really only want 1:00 or 2:00, you're going to cut your own throat. That's just my editorial comment here.

MR. PRZYBYSZEWSKI: I took every manager and myself down here, and we actually asked for feedback from the young lady that was sitting here earlier, and we told them we only wanted extended hours in some cases. She was coaching us, and that's the direction that she gave us. I apologize for that, and I apologized earlier.

00005 CHAIRMAN BOHL: We'll still take up the 1 application. Do you at this point wish to amend your plan of operation for different hours, or do you want 4 to continue to try to go the route of 24 hours? 5 MR. PRZYBYSZEWSKI: We would like to amend 6 it to 2:00 a.m. 7 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Do you want to give me the 8 specifics here now on what days. 9 MS. CAREW: Just Fridays and Saturdays. 10 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Fridays and Saturdays you 11 would like to operate from I'm going to guess is it 12 6:00 a.m.? 13 MS. CAREW: We open at 5:00 a.m. 14 CHAIRMAN BOHL: You want to go 5:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m., so it would be 05:00 to --15 16 MR. SCHRIMPF: 02:00. And Mr. Chairman --17 CHAIRMAN BOHL: And that would, what his 18 caveat is going to be then is really Saturday morning 19 you want hours from Friday night to Saturday morning, 20 from Saturday night until Sunday morning to 2:00 a.m. 21 Is that correct? 22 MS. CAREW: Um-hum. 23 CHAIRMAN BOHL: And other than that, what 2.4 you're requesting then functionally is your existing 25 hours per zoning then, which would be 11:00 a.m. on

those other nights of the week.

ALDERMAN DAVIS: You know, the way the ordinance is written right now is that if we deny this, this particular location will actually get an extended hour to operate into 12:00, and with the alderman objecting to the 24-hour granting of it, I think it can serve both purposes. I think the establishment can operate to 12:00 but yet and still not grant the 24 hours. And then I would assume that you would work with Alderman Murphy to request extended hours.

But right now, I'm not -- I couldn't support 24 hours or any amendment to the application because I know that if, in fact, you're operating until 11:00 currently, the way that the ordinance is written is that if we don't approve this, then the business can operate all the way up until 12:00 midnight legitimately.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: Alderman, that is not true. MR. SCHRIMPF: They can do that now. They don't need any permission of anybody.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: Yeah. And in fact, even if we reject this, they're not allowed to operate after 12:00 midnight, they would still have to abide by whatever their special use permit would be with

Zoning. I'm going to garner that based on what they've indicated here that their zoning allows them to go to 11:00 p.m., and that wouldn't change. So even if we reject it, they don't get the free hour. It would just throw them back to whatever zoning has been approved from the Board of Zoning Appeals, which would be the hours, I'm going to surmise, between 5:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. So yeah, they don't functionally get a free hour.

MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. Chairman, for what it's worth to the committee, I have been to that restaurant at 5:00 in the morning when I'm headed out to Madison on the business of the National Guard.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: Alderman Davis.

ALDERMAN DAVIS: I mentioned before, I'm interested in what the operating hours is granted by BOZA because it may be a business decision reason why they're operating until only 11:00, so BOZA may have granted them to operate into the 12:00 but the business decision may have been made to operate only until 11:00. So until we get that information before us, let's not assume that BOZA has granted them 11:00 operating hours. It could be granted until 12:00, but it could be a business decision on not to operate until 12:00 but until 11:00, so I just want to make

sure that I put that on the table. Because I've been in discussion with representatives from BOZA, and they indicated to me some way that we can come to a conclusion as far as getting the information before this committee when we make decisions on these matters.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: I'm in concurrence we run into this on many occasions. Let me just let you know here, in terms of the applicants, the one truth be told is if we approve it even for those two prospective days, you have vested property rights there, and even if Alderman Murphy later on doesn't like things, that he has some concern with that, it's very difficult to take away vested property rights in such a license, truth to be told here. Alderman Dudzik.

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: I just have a question, comment. I'm kind of hesitant to give any leeway here at all. I'd like to hear what the alderman's office has to say about the deals that were apparently engaged in right now, whether it's 12:00 or 1:00, or has Alderman Murphy given you any sense of that?

MS. SEWELL: Alderman Murphy would be opposed to any extended hours at this time.

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Thank you.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: I'm going to ask you to provide any other input you want.

MS. CAREW: We can tell Mr. Murphy that if we were to have any problems, we'd immediately shut off the lights, call the police, do what we needed to do. I do work with the high school behind us, am very involved with their student council building a respective relationship, because there are a lot of problems at the school, and they have vandalized the restaurant, and that has stopped. We have hired private security so that there's no fights, there's no trouble.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: If there aren't any other questions, this matter is in committee. We do have the application before us with just a change for the hours Friday night into Saturday morning and Saturday evening into Sunday morning going from midnight to 2:00, an extension from midnight to 2:00. Is there a motion by committee?

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Move to deny.

CHAIRMAN BOHL: Alderman, do you want to cite a specific objection here?

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Based on the alderman's hesitation for the extended hours but also that the location if licensed 24 hours would lead to excessive

00010 1 noise, late night disturbances, litter, loitering, traffic generated by the 24-hour license, and health, safety, and welfare of the adjoining residents. 4 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Essentially, the entire 5 objection. 6 ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Yes. 7 CHAIRMAN BOHL: The motion by Alderman 8 Dudzik is denial based on the aforementioned 9 objections. Is there any discussion? Is there any 10 objection? Hearing none, so ordered. 11 At this point here, we're reluctant. I 12 would suggest if you want to pursue an additional 13 avenue, you could talk to Alderman Murphy. There's 14 potentially the ability for this committee to 15 reconsider prior, take up those two days, but that 16 would be something that I would suggest you would talk 17 to directly Alderman Murphy on if you so desire. 18 Thank you. * * * 19
