# COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS (CIP)

- NIDC CIP grants support projects that **engage community members** and **physically improves** Milwaukee neighborhoods.
  - City-wide program opportunities
  - Dollar-for-dollar matching grants up to \$4,000
  - ► Reimbursable grants
  - New this year: The first \$1,000 is a no-match grant.

# Overview of Community Improvement Projects

- City budget allocates funding to NIDC for implementation of citywide CIPs
- ▶ 16 projects were approved in 2023 for over \$66,614
- Leveraged dollar amount more than \$73,818

#### 2023 Bloom & Groom Event:

\$1,500 match grants to host flower/vegetable sales that fosters neighborhood engagement and camaraderie

\*18 participating community partners, 75 volunteers, \$15,000 matched





#### Fall Frolic Partnerships:

\$1,000 reimbursable match grants for Fall-themed community events

\*10 Participating community partners, \$10,000 matched





#### 2023 Goals Met

- Collaborated with partners to promote CIP projects in TIN areas, with plans to expand to new TINs in 2025.
- Strengthened collaboration with partners to actively promote program applications citywide.
- Provided the art community with information on CIP resources available for community and resident-driven projects.

## Goals for the Upcoming Year

Expand outreach efforts to engage more residents and community organizations in CIP projects, aiming for a 15% increase in participation across diverse neighborhoods. This objective focuses on inclusivity and demonstrates the program's commitment to fostering community-led improvements.

Create a maintenance plan for public spaces in collaboration with ECO, MKE Parks, and DPW.
