WHEREAS, Originally founded in 1936 as the Alverno Campus Elementary School, Woodlands School became a private, independent school in 1989, and was chartered through the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2003; and

WHEREAS, Woodlands received the 2014 National School of Character award from the Character Education Partnership and is distinguished for developing lifelong learners through a multidisciplinary approach; and

WHEREAS, In April 2014, Woodlands was identified as an arts-focused institution by the Public Policy Forum, and partnered with the Arts and Community Education Program, a platform that brings a variety of professional musicians, including members of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra and the Skylight Music Theatre, into the school; now, therefore, be it
