Appropriation of 2001 HOME Reprogramming funds

The Community Development Committee on July 31, 2001 and the Common Council on August 2, 2001 approved 2002 Community Development program activity and subrecipients under the Community Development Block Grant Program, the HOME program, and the Emergency Shelter Grant Program. A summary of what remains to be allocated follows:

The entitlement funding for 2002 is estimated at \$31,783,000 which includes CDBG funding at \$23,000,000, HOME funding at \$8,000,000 and ESG funding at \$783,000. HOPWA funding is estimated at \$400,000.
