will be taken today, but no final decision will bemade today as HPC will consider the entire district next cycle. The state will not support historic tax credits unless all three buildings survive.
Staff believes that this building meets six criteria for designation --s. 320-21-3- f-1, f-3, f-5, f-6, f-8 and f-9, which are detailed in the Study Report.
