



BMA COMPONENT: FORGING A COMMON VISION

Vision statements, when useful, are actionable. Efforts to communicate a set of measurable goals that reflect the vision narrow the view further. Finding indicators against which to track progress in the goals, pushes more things off the table. On the other hand, some vision statements can be too long to remember. They need to be boiled down to a catchy phrase and, some would argue, a single indicator or a very tight, logically connected set of indicators that are used consistently to convey progress toward the vision. Consider two ways to make vision stronger:

- 1. Identify a communicable goal that conveys urgency.
- 2. Adopt a common language and framework that lends itself to frequent, flexible use

BMA COMPONENT: ENGAGING ALL STAKEHOLDERS

What does the BMA stakeholder engagement landscape look like in your city?

Who is for Black men and boys in your city? Which stakeholder groups are the most engaged and committed? (think about their actions, not their memberships on the commission or action team).

Who are the most sought after? Which stakeholder groups are most frequently invited to (or wished for at) decision-making tables when the topic is children, Black men and boys, education, etc.?

Who are the most ignored? Which stakeholder groups are most frequently left out, even though they really do have a stake in the solutions?

Who have the most capacity? Which groups have structures behind them that make it easier for them to be engaged as a group and easier for them to respond or advocate?

What are opportunities for the mayor and/or other local elected officials to be more engaged?

What steps can be taken to engage young black men and boys in your planning and decision-making process?

Based on our discussion, what are some next steps that should be taken to continue efforts to engage <u>diverse</u> stakeholders?





BMA COMPONENT: SHARED ACCOUNTABILITY

In order to lay the groundwork for a strong, shared accountability system there are two possible things to consider: 1) Common definitions of outcomes, of services/supports and 2) Public ownership of big picture goals in each area. Mark Friedman has been successful at helping cities understand how to implement Results Based Accountability and offers many exercises for thinking through this process (i.e., A Tool for Choosing a Common Language).

The Forum also offers the "Dashboard" Process that leads to a series of decisions about the desired results for children and Black men and boys (outcomes, goals) and the desired performance measures for systems. The chart visually summarizes the process but working through the details helps cities avoid the "forest/trees" problem.

BMA COMPONENT: COMPREHENSIVE STRATEGIES

This is a critical but difficult component to a Black men and boys planning process – understanding and articulating the strategies within a lens that all stakeholders can agree makes sense. The National League of Cities created an Action Guide for Black Male Achievement and described strategies in four areas:

- 1. Improving educational attainment
- 2. Expanding job opportunities
- 3. Strengthening families
- 4. Reducing violence

As your city advances a comprehensive strategy for Black men and boys, the landscape should also include efforts to:

- 1. Improve and coordinate systems and services
- 2. Align policy and resources (public and private)
- 3. Increase demand for support
- 4. Engage young people and their families

BMA COMPONENT: COORDINATING INFRASTUCTURES

When your city is ready to implement their Black men and boys plan, strong consideration must be given to identifying individuals and organizations that have the capacity, motivation, and mandate to monitor and report on the efforts taking place to implement the Black men and boys plan. These individuals or organizations must work across issues, systems, and stakeholder groups to accomplish two things:

- Create the coordination, communication, and accountability systems and structures needed to manage and sustain a long term commitment to the BMA process
- 2. Align and strengthen existing efforts essential to the strategies for Black men and boys articulated in the BMA plan

The coordinating infrastructure could involve engaging a community collaborative, using an intermediary organization, or establishing a coordinating body. If a decision is to create multiple structures, then careful attention should be paid to how the coordinating infrastructure meets the goals of the strategies for Black men and boys that was established through the Black men and boys planning process (see chart).
