2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 618

November 8, 2001 – Introduced by Representatives La Fave, Ott, Lassa, Musser, Sinicki, Ladwig, Gronemus, Ryba, Townsend and Young, cosponsored by Senators Burke, Schultz and Kanavas. Referred to Committee on Criminal Justice.

1 AN ACT to amend 941.20 (1) (c); and to create 941.20 (4) of the statutes; relating

to: pointing a firearm at a law enforcement officer and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person may not intentionally point a firearm at or toward another person. A person who violates this prohibition may be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than nine months or both. This bill increases the maximum term of imprisonment for a person who intentionally points a firearm at or toward a law enforcement officer to 15 years.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who intentionally marks, draws, or writes on or etches onto another person's property without the person's consent may be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than nine months or both. If, however, the property is reduced in value by more than \$2,500, the maximum term of imprisonment is ten years. This bill lowers the damage threshold at which the longer term of imprisonment may be imposed to \$1,000.
